The daytime dress mode varies in hue all the way from bright blue, rose-reds and grass-greens to dark blue, beige and black — all of which promise to be popular. The new frocks are similar in only one respect — almost all are complicated in design. Even morning dresses of apparently simple cut reveal intricate incrustations and diagonal seams in both bodice and skirt. There are jaunty pleurms swaying from waistlines, gored or accordion-pleated tiers and occasional tunic of intricate design. Belts of braided cord, crushed leathers, or twisted silk crepes combining several colors further complicate spring frocks. Sleeves this spring may be short. Many street models display sleeves of elbow or three-quarter length, while frocks for formal afternoon wear are designed with caps or capes over the upper arm. Lingerie collars and cuffs are noted everywhere. They may be white or a pastel shade of organdy, pique or English eyelet embroidery. Brown crepe frocks with lemon yellow collars and cuffs, navy blue with pastel pink and black with white are favorite combinations. In dress fabrics there are plain, diagonal-striped and flecked wools, and monotone, checked, polka-dotted or plaid silks. They may match or contrast with the coat and the new frocks for formal afternoon wear are designed with caps or capes over the upper arm. Lingerie collars and cuffs are noted everywhere.
