Legge Not Optimist On Wheat Reduction

WASHINGTON, Mar. 6 (P)—Referring to the failure of growers to cut acreage, Chairman Legge of the farm board said yesterday the cotton farmer "at last is trying to put the price down to five cents" and the wheat farmer "quit growing wheat when it gets down to 25 cents."

When it comes to acreage reduction, he said, farmers are too willing "to let George do it."

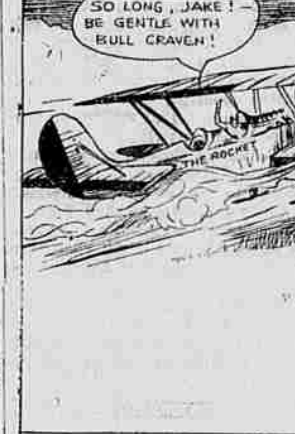
Asked if he saw any immediate possibility for five cent cotton, Legge said, "There is no question but if they raise as much this year as they have been, the price will be lower than anything they have seen yet."

He believed, however, there would be some reduction in cotton acreage this year, but "not as much as it ought to be."

Regarding wheat, while reduction

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this year will be small, the chairman still saw the possibility the acreage would be cut 20 per cent within two years.

Ship in Bad Storm With No Propellor

HALIFAX, N. S., Mar. 6 (P)—The Purness Witty line steamer Rosalind, from St. Johns, Newfoundland, to Halifax, has lost a propellor and is at the mercy of the storm now lashing the North Atlantic, the marine agency here announced yesterday. She carried about 30 passengers.

The vessel was reported about 100 miles northeast of Sable island. Two ships have left here to aid the Rosalind.

Plan to Bridge Columbia River At The Dalles

THE DALLES, Ore., Mar. 6 (P)—A commission of nine members, instructed to proceed at once with plans looking to the construction of a toll bridge across the Columbia river here, was appointed Wednesday

night by Mayor Fred Thompson, acting on the recommendation of a joint committee of local business men.

George H. Flagg, publisher of the Optimist, was elected chairman of the commission, which includes C. R. Callaway, R. T. Yates and H. E. Walthers, city councilmen; Ben R. Little, publisher of the Chronicle; F. S. Gunning, Dr. Thompson Co. berth; N. A. Bonn and Ray P. Kelly. Congress recently approved construction of the bridge and the enabling bill had been signed by the president. The Oregon legislature last week passed a bill extending to cities the same rights enjoyed by counties relative to financing and constructing toll bridges across interstate streams.
