WASHINGTON—At the foot of the huge table in the room where the members of the House foreign affairs committee every Tuesday sits a kindly man by the name of Edmund Frederick Erk, of Pennsylvania.

He is the Iowa ranking Republican member of his party on that important committee. He must be proud of that seat, even if it is at the end of the table.

For he is now in position to do more than merely toy with something which for more than 10 years he has regarded as a hobby.

Erk was at one time secretary to the late Stephen Porter, chairman of the foreign affairs committee. It is Porter's seat in the house which he now fills.

In 1919, when the Republicans wrested control of the house from the Democrats, Porter was made chairman of this committee, and he gave the clerkship to Erk.

Erk, of independent means, immediately made a hobby of his job. The salary was of little inducement to him, but he put all his energy into his work.

He was everlastingly at it. Often he would be found in the committee room as late as four o'clock in the morning. Regular hours meant little to him when there was something to be done.

He hit upon a scheme in those days that made his name known throughout the world, although very few knew him personally. The scheme cost him three times the salary he received from the government, and the work involved was tremendous.

Every Christmas all his acquaintances, every ambassador, minister and consul in the diplomatic service of this country received from him an elaborate greeting.

Upon the death of Porter he took his place in congress, elected not only to fill out Porter's unexpired term, but for the next regular term as well.

Stabilized Wheat Price Asked For Northwest Port

WASHINGTON, D. C., Mar. 12 (AP)—Assurances from the federal farm board that it will attempt to avert any price break in the grain market in the Pacific Northwest that might imperil the next harvest, has been received by Senator Frederick Steiwer of Oregon, he said yesterday.

The Oregon senator met with the farm board Tuesday and asked for a stabilized price of wheat at Portland, corresponding with the Chicago price.

The board understands, Steiwer said, that export wheat in the Pacific Northwest constitutes a problem different from that in any other part of the country. The senator was supported by a statement from E. B. Aldrich of Pendleton.

Possibility that the federal relief act approved by congress may be liberalized to permit Oregon farmers to borrow money for summer fallow work, was seen by Steiwer.

The senator said the appointments of George Wright of Pendleton, D. M. McKay of Condon, and W. H. Steiwer of Forest, to pass on applications for drought relief loans to Eastern Oregon farmers, has been approved.
