WASHINGTON, Mar. 14 (AP)—Five literary classics once tabooed by Uncle Sam have obtained official sanction in this country under liberalization of censorship effected by the 1930 tariff act.

New Experiment Station Will Be Near Hermiston

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis, Mar. 14.—A new and adequate experiment station on the Hermiston irrigation project which will replace the present branch station established in 1906 is assured with the passage of a \$55,000 appropriation for that purpose by congress just before adjournment.

The present station was established on a 40 acre tract at a time when fruit growing was considered the best enterprise for the reclamation district.

National Parks Are Natural Laboratory

WASHINGTON, Mar. 14 (AP)—America's national parks were described yesterday by Director Albright of the park service as great natural laboratories for studying geological and other natural phenomena at first hand.
