Work for Reduction Of Oil Importations

WASHINGTON, Mar. 14 (AP)—President Hoover said yesterday that negotiations looking to reduction in imports of oil will have little effect on the oil situation unless the East Texas pool "shall be prorated on the same basis as other new pools."

He made the statement after Secretary Wilbur had announced all importing companies except one had agreed to limit importations.

The oil conservation board is now carrying on negotiations for a limitation of imports.

Commission Okays King Tut Knockout

NEW YORK, Mar. 14 (AP)—The New York State Athletic commission yesterday closed its investigation of the recent King Tut-Billy Petrolie fight and ordered that the purses of both fighters be paid. The purses had been held up pending an investigation of Petrolie's fourth round knockout of the boxer who had knocked him out but a few weeks before.

Minnesota Seniors Threaten Walk-out

ST. PAUL, Minn., Mar. 14 (AP)—More than 100 seniors at the University of Minnesota farm school yesterday threatened to "walk out" of commencement exercises March 25 unless 13 of their fellow classmates, suspended for liquor drinking, are allowed to graduate. The thirteen were among seventeen students at the school involved in suspensions.

While the campus seethed with indignation over what students termed "unfairness," preparations were made to launch a legislative inquiry into the circumstances of the case yesterday.

Truck Driver Is Fatally Injured

PORTLAND, Mar. 14 (AP)—Ralph Collier, 34, was fatally injured here yesterday when he was thrown from the driver's seat of his truck and pinned under the machine after it was overturned in a collision.

Helen Code, 20, the driver of the other car involved, was taken to a hospital with minor head injuries.

Max Gangman, who witnessed the accident, said both cars were moving between 35 and 40 miles an hour.
