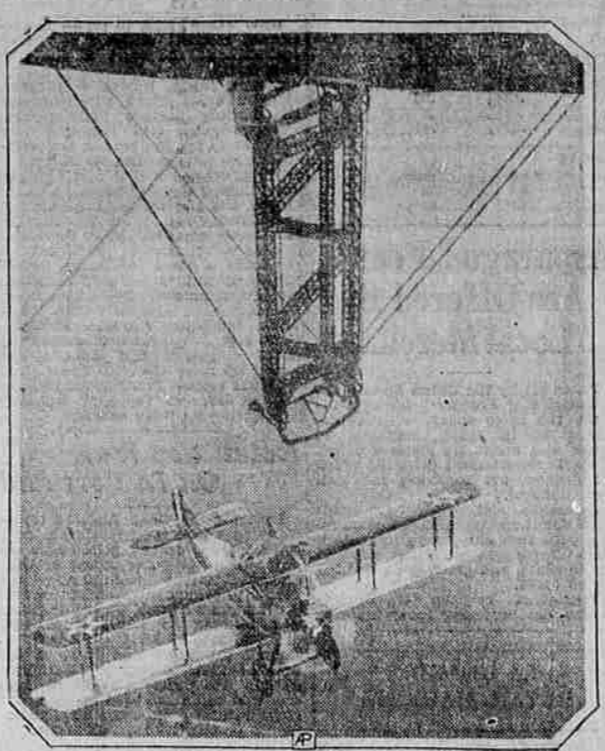

NEW AIRSHIPS TO BENEFIT FROM TESTS WHEN LOS ANGELES 'DIES' AS MARTYR

WASHINGTON (AP)—The airship Los Angeles, eventually slated to take second rank as the pride of the navy when the super-dirigible Akron is completed, will "die" as a martyr to lighter-than-air science.

Its useful life, which the span predicted in 1924 by its German maker, is estimated to continue between two and four years longer. Then its declining days will be spent in destructive tests.

The navy plans to use the craft, as it has been able to use no dirigible before, in a series of experiments from which may be learned new facts on devices for mechanical handling, launching and mooring afloat.

While detailed plans have not been drawn, the series will be run to yield the most information before final tests to reduce the ship to junk.

Built in 1924 by the German Zep-

lin company as a "treaty ship" for the United States, the Los Angeles has been a training craft for the navy's lighter-than-air personnel and a laboratory for testing many developments which have advanced airship science.

Some of these will be incorporated in the Akron, now under construction and its sister ship, the ZRS-5.

Among major experiments to be tested in the Los Angeles which will find a place in the Akron are successful developments of radio, trapeze equipment for taking on and launching airplanes, new materials to hold the lifting gas, mechanical handling and water recovery apparatus.

New Radios Successful
On its trip to Panama, to take part in the 1931 fleet maneuvers the airship gave the first real test to its new radio sets, mounted in September, by maintaining communication at will with Washington and its home base. Sets patterned after this equipment will be provided for the Akron.

The hook-on and take-off experiments with airplanes will be reflected in the Akron in arrangements for storage within the hull of five com-

plete airplanes and a hinged trapeze that will permit them to leave the dirigible in flight and return when missions are complete.

Gas cells have been fabricated of a number of materials and tested in the Los Angeles in a search of a substitute for gold beater's skin. As a result the Akron will have half its cells made of rubberized fabric and the other half of gelatin latex.

ST. LOUIS (AP)—The red spider, one of the most troublesome pests to gardeners and florists, is being combated in Shaw's gardens here with a solution of glue.

One pound of glue in five gallons of water is used as a spray in the greenhouses, with marked success.

Within two or three days after application the film of glue dries, curls and rolls off the leaves, bringing with it both spiders and eggs.
