

WORKMEN START EARLY ATTACKS ON HUGE PROJECT

regular course of the river while the dam itself is under construction.

The dam will be the largest in the world, and will create the largest artificial lake. The Colorado water backing up before the huge pile of masonry will form a great reservoir 116 miles long, with a shore line of 650 miles. At high water, its surface will be 1,228 feet above sea level.

The power development will overshadow both Niagara Falls and Muscle Shoals. The former generates 550,000 horsepower for the United States. Muscle Shoals' ultimate development is put at 600,000 horsepower. The Hoover dam will generate between 1,000,000 and 1,200,000.

The materials needed for the great dam are counted in millions. There will be 3,600,000 yards of concrete masonry, requiring 5,000,000 barrels of cement and 19,000,000 pounds of reinforcing steel.

Six Years For Task.

The government, in accepting the bid of the Six Companies, Inc., on March 11, specified that actual work shall start within 30 days, and that the whole project shall be completed in six years.

It will take four years to complete the concrete work alone. By September, 1936, the electrical plant at the dam will be supplying current to the city of Los Angeles and the Southern California Edison company under contract.

In about a year another government contract will be let for construction of the All-American canal which will deliver water to Southern California. This project will cost approximately \$35,500,000.

To Repay Cost in 34 Years.

The cost of the entire flood control, water supply and power program in the Colorado will approximate \$165,000,000. The sale of power and the delivery of water for irrigation purposes is to repay the government that sum in 34 years.

Boulder City will be completed within a year. The water power system will be finished by June, and after that the building will go ahead.

Frank Crowe, of Boise, Ida., for many years an engineer for the United States reclamation service, will act as general superintendent in charge of the entire construction. He was employed as general manager for the Six Companies, Inc., a group which pooled its resources and equipment because the job was considered too big for a single concern.

17 Illinois Prison Musicians In Riot

JOLIET, Ill. Mar. 18 (AP)—The prison band at the new Stateville penitentiary engaged in a private insurrection yesterday and when the din was ended five convicts went to the emergency hospital for treatment.

The seventeen players and fought among themselves over the suggestion of one of their number that a riot be instigated. The prisoners were at hand practice when the suggestion was made. No guards were present.

Deputy Warden Frank Kneiss, in charge at Stateville, quelled the fight in short order.

FIRST AMERICANS HAD BLOND HAIR

DENVER (AP)—Contrary to general belief, the early American had brown, curly hair.

Examination of the skulls of a number of Mesa Verde cliff dwellers in Colorado has revealed that brown hair was the rule and not the exception, says Dr. George Woodbury, curator of archaeology and ethnology of the Colorado state museum.

The modern Indian has hair of the mongoloid type—black, straight and coarse, with a round cross-section. Wavy brown hair has an oval cross-section and is kidney-shaped.

Dr. Woodbury hopes to trace the origin of the Indians through hair types. Many ethnologists believe the red man to be of Asiatic origin, and an examination of the hair of tribes in the Bering Strait district may throw light on that theory. It was at Bering Strait that the Mongolian migrations are believed to have entered North America.

INCOME TAX ESTIMATES

PORTLAND, March 17 (AP)—Although the internal revenue office is still swamped with the tabulation of last minute income tax returns, Collector Clyde G. Huntley said today that while the total number of returns will exceed that of last year, the money collected will fall below the figure for 1930.

URGENT REAPPOINTMENT

WASHINGTON, March 17 (AP)—Senators McNary and Steiwer of Oregon recommended to President Hoover today that Jefferson Meyers, of Portland, Ore., be reappointed a member of the shipping board.
