Germany Dole Affords Scant Family Budget

BERLIN (AP)-- What the wife of a jobless German must face in the way of a household budget was shown when one of these men outlined for Berlin newspapermen his weekly dole of \$8.75 a week.

This man has a wife and child, yet manages to get in a few smokes and some beer and brandy for himself. The budget included: Rent, \$1.25; meat and fish, \$1.21; bread, 75 cents; vegetables, 70 cents; sugar, 14 cents; lard, 37 cents; milk, 10 cents; coffee, 15 cents; beer and brandy, 19 cents; cigars, 18 cents; heat and light, 47 cents; soap, 17 cents; sweets, 4 cents; miscellaneous, 7 cents.

Meat is the largest item for the table because it is expensive here. But the amount used would scarcely buy one good roast. So the housewife probably buys horse meat twice a week and cheap beef once.

Not all of Germany's 5,000,000 jobless get this unemployment pay. It is estimated that 2,000,000 men and women are in this latter class.

Poland Succumbs To Europe's Wave Of Pay Reductions

WARSAW (AP)-- Starting April 1, when government employees will take a 15 per cent cut in salaries, the European movement for reduced pay as a means of combating hard times will invade Poland.

The Warsaw government has resisted the advance of this panacea for economic ills, but it succumbed when its budget balance sheets showed a deficit.

The government has announced it will keep the reductions in force for a few months as an experiment.

Until the first of the year Poland was one of the few European states with a surplus. The December 31 balance, however, went to the red side of the ledger.
