

Preferably the house should face the north on a lot no smaller than 50 by 100 feet. A wider lot would be better and one deeper than 100 feet would be more suitable for a long English garden.

Designate Books To Be Purchased **Under New Laws**

SALEM, April 6 (P)—Textbooks in reading for the first, second, third, fifth, seventh and eighth grades, and geographies for the fourth and sixth grades, and a civies text for the eighth grade were designated as books for first purchase by school districts under the new free textbook law at a mosting of the state board of education at was announced Saturday. All of west textbooks are recent adoptions and are not owned at present by the pupil of the schools. The new law calls for an annual levy of \$1.50 per enrolled child in the elementary grades for the purchase of textbooks until such time as sill books are supplied; thereafter this levy will need to be in only such amount as may be necessary for keeping the supply up to requirements. In these districts in which the fund raised by the required levy is sufficient to purchase more books than those set forth on the designated list, the board has recommended that additional copies of one or more of the text books now in use be secured to supply the classes.

The handiling of textbook orders through regional depositories of pub-

supply the classes.

The handling of textbook orders through regional depositories of publishing companies at Portland was decided upon by the board as the most feasible method of distribution. The books may be purchased in this way at a 15 per cent discount F O B. Portland. For some years the J. K. Gill company has acted as the distributing agency for all the textbook publishing companies doing business in Oregon, but it is understood that other companies are interested in entering this line of business.

The decision of the state board of education to have distribution of textbooks made through regional distributions was made with the understanding that in case more than one reliable distributing agency arranges to handle textbooks in this territory on the same basis, school officials will be given a choice as to the one through which their orders shall be handled.
