Mrs. Compton Is Called Beyond At Union Home

Connor (Observer Correspondent) UNION (Special) - Mrs. Margaret Compton died at the home of her daughter in Union Saturday morning at seven o'clock following a brief illness, although she had been in poor health during most of the winter. She was 82 years old at the time of her death, having been born January 7, 1849 in Ohio. In 1887 she moved to Nebraska and in 1917 came to Oregon, making her home near Haines with a son during the past few years. She was a member of the Friends church. She is survived by four sons, A. M. Compton, of Montana, L. W. Compton, of California; Seth Compton, who lives in Nebraska, and W. F. Compton, who was living with his mother at the time of her death, and one daughter, Mrs. Lizzie Carter, of Union.

The sons had been notified of their mother's serious illness and some of them were on their way to Union when she died. The body is at the Cook Brothers parlors in Union. Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock the funeral services will be held at Haines and interment made in the Haines cemetery. Rev. R. C. Lee of the local Methodist church will have charge of the services. Sunday evening the Woman's club presented a very interesting Longfellow and Tennyson program at the Methodist church. Besides the numbers on the club program, which were presented under the direction of Miss Helen Schaper, Glase Vaden rendered "Holy City" as a cornet solo with Miss Elbet Conklin as accompanist. PAWHUSKA, Okla., Apr. 13 (AP)—President Hoover's Uncle Luban, Maj. L. J. Miles, is dead. Major Miles, 67, former Indian agent who opened his home to the fatherless Herbert Hoover here 43 years ago succumbed yesterday. Both the president and Vice President Charles Curtis were "his boy." Mr. Hoover, following the death of his father in West Branch, Ia., spent a year in the big stone residence from which the Osage Indians were ruled. Mr. Curtis, on the rolls of the Kaw tribe as a youth, was under the guardianship of Major Miles.
