URGES CAUTIOUS ACTION IN STATE EDUCATION WORK

RESEBURG, Ore., Apr. 15 (AP)—A statement urging the state board of higher education to act slowly on recommendations of the federal department of education, relative to the state university and state college, was made here Monday by C. A. Brand of Roseburg, for ten years a member

of the board of higher curricula, and chairman for two terms.

Brand said, "The organization is inevitable, because the state's program is wrong, but because it has not been adhered to."

The board of higher curricula was appointed to eliminate undesirable duplications and to approve new courses and changes. The board, Brand said, was unable to enforce its rulings, the need of a stronger hand was seen, with the resulting appointment of the state board of education to replace the board of regents and the board of curricula.

A study of the records and rulings of the board of higher curricula reveal the fact that the unjustifiable duplications and encroachments complained of in the federal report were in fact violations of the rulings of the board," Brand declared. He said the state college had not been as cheerful in accepting limitations placed by the board as the university had been.

Attacking the recommendation to separate science courses from the university, Brand said this would demote the university "from its high position in the educational world to a third-rate school."

Science courses at the same time, he said, would be of little value at the university, and costly new buildings would be necessary to accommodate the transferred science work.

"Undoubtedly," Brand said, "our own board of education is aware there have been other surveys by experts in other states, where similar situations have existed, but not one favored the major recommendations of the Oregon survey. When doctors offer the immediate family must insist on extreme caution."

Indian Sentenced To Serve 10 Years

SPOKANE, Wash., April 15 (AP)—Joseph Seymour, Kalispell Indian convicted of killing his brother Louis in a drunken brawl, was sentenced in federal court Monday to serve ten years for manslaughter.

The government charged Seymour with first degree murder, saying he shot Louis down in cold blood with a rifle during the squabbling of a party of drunken Indians on the reservation.

Judge J. Stanley Webster ruled out the first degree charge, saying the act was manslaughter, "the mind not capable of functioning cannot premeditate."

He suggested to the jury the manslaughter verdict, saying "unfortunately, under the law, voluntary intoxication does not constitute a defense against manslaughter."

May Provide Books In School Budgets

SALEM, April 15 (AP)—Free textbooks, as far as the expenditure of \$1.50 per pupil will permit, may be provided pupils of grade schools this fall, if the budgets provided for such expenditure are voted upon for the present school year, an opinion by the state attorney general held.

The opinion was requested by C. A. Howard, superintendent of public instruction. Those districts voting budgets in June for the coming year, are expected to include the item for textbooks. Those voting in October for the next year, the opinion states, cannot include the item. It is being suggested by the state superintendent that those districts desiring to make use of the free textbooks this fall, make provision for holding their budget elections before the fall term starts.
