Menus of The Day

By Mrs. Alexander George QUICK CINNAMON ROLLS Stewed Prunes, chilled Cooked Wheat Cereal and Cream French Toast Honey Coffee Luncheon

Escalloped Tuna Baked Potatoes Bread Butter Head Lettuce and Russian Dressing Rhubarb Meringue Pie Coffee

Quick Cinnamon Rolls 2 cups flour, 4 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 3 tablespoons lard, 2-3 cup milk, 2 tablespoons soft butter, 1/2 cup dark brown sugar, 1/2 cup raisins, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, mix these, add 1/2 cup baking powder and salt. Cut in the lard with a knife.

Escalloped Tuna, Serving 6 1 1/2 cups tuna, 4 tablespoons butter, 4 tablespoons flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon paprika, 2 cups milk, 1/2 cup diced, cooked celery, 2 tablespoons chopped pimientos. Melt the butter and add the dry ingredients. Mix and add the milk and cook until creamy sauce forms.

CORRECT TWO ERRORS MADE IN MEASURES

SALEM, April 21 (AP)—A miniature session of the state legislature was held at the executive offices here yesterday at which time two errors attributed to enrolling committees of the two houses of the recent legislature were corrected.

One of the measures was the house bill which reduces the rate of interest on delinquent taxes from 12 per cent to 8 per cent. The measure was amended in the senate to make its provisions retroactive to taxes due in 1928 and thereafter.
