

AMERICA TO RECOGNIZE NEW SPAIN

Stimson Authorized Ambassador Laughlin to Take Action.

FOUR BIG POWERS EXTEND FRIENDSHIP

In Meantime, Daughters of American Revolution Plan Action Against Russians.

WASHINGTON, Apr. 22 (AP)—Secretary Stimson announced today Ambassador Laughlin, at Madrid, would extend American recognition to the new Spanish government.

The action followed closely similar action taken by Great Britain, France and Germany.

The ambassador in his report to the secretary said he had arranged to formally carry out his instructions by calling at the Spanish foreign office today.

MOVE AGAINST RUSSIA.
WASHINGTON, Apr. 22.—(Continued) non-recognition of Russia, exclusion of all that nation's products, and legislation to require public officials to swear to the oath of allegiance were demanded in a report prepared today for the annual congress of Daughters of the American Revolution.

A committee on national legislation proposed that members "banish from our various households all articles whose production or importation is the result of slave labor."

The report was ready for convention action after an address by Representative Jenkins, Republican, Ohio, in which he urged that the proposed law changes in the next congress to exclude "communists" and other undesirable aliens.

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**PARAGRAPH IS
DELETED FROM
CLUB REPORT**

NEW YORK, Apr. 22 (AP)—The national Republican club has expunged references to the private life of Mayor Walker from a report of a committee of the club.

Action was taken last night after three hours' vigorous debate before 200 members on a report which had been drafted by the club's city affairs committee. The deleted passage read:

"He (Mayor Walker) has joked about being junketed to race tracks, sat up all night at wild parties, entertained Hollywood and ignored the city's problems. Every man, of course, has a right to live his private life as he sees fit so far as consistent with his obligations to others, and we have no concern with Mayor Walker and his escapades except in so far as they interfere with his public duties. The mayor of New York has no right

to allow the vagaries of his private life to interfere with reasonable attention to the responsibilities of his great office.

With the exception of the references to private life, the club approved the report censoring the mayor.
