YANGTSE PATROL LEADER ENDS DUTIES, BUT FIGHT AGAINST BANDIT'S CONTINUES



Work of protecting American commerce and citizens against Chinese bandits along the Yangtze river has ended for Rear Admiral Thomas A. Craven (left) who is returning to United States. But the fleet headed by the Luzon (below) will continue to battle outlaws along the river shown in map.

SHANGHAI (AP) - Rear Admiral Thomas A. Craven is preparing to haul down his pennant from the smallest flagship in the American navy and return to the United States. He will reach home late in May and the flag will be hoisted on the USS Luzon, a tiny craft which draws only six feet. But her sides are scarred with machine gun bullets and scrap iron fired from ancient brass cannon and her deck is pocked by the shrapnel of bandits from the precipitous slopes of the great gorge of the Yangtze.

The fighting started years ago, and has had little or no letup. Along the mighty Chinese waterway the patrol crews watch over American commerce, business men and missionaries. While the native communists and outlaws are frequently armed only with muzzle loading muskets and ancient brass cannon, some of them have modern rifles and machine guns. They take their potshots at river traffic from behind solid breastworks of mud and underground.

United States armed vessels have been on the Yangtze ever since 1871, and Admiral Craven has been one of the most popular of all the officers who have been "the old man" to the fleet. Craven is completing a regular tour of duty. His successor will carry on his work and the fleet will carry on.

He comes from a family steeped in the tradition of the United States navy. One of his great-grandfathers was Commodore Thomas Truxton, who served in the Coast and Cutter Service. His other great-grandfather was Commodore Thomas Tingley, who was a captain in the first navy.

World Mark Is Established In Corvallis Meet

CORVALLIS, Ore., Apr. 25 (AP) - A new world intercollegiate record in the 440-yard relay was established, and two meet records broken in the University of Oregon-Oregon State college dual relay here yesterday, won by Oregon, six to three.

The state college shuttle team set a world mark, while the university broke meet records in the 440-yard relay and distance medley. Oregon won the 440, the two-mile, the 800, the sprint medley and the distance medley, while the state college took the shuttle, the four-mile and the mile.

Sluggers Breaks Loose Friday In Major League

The major league pitchers have generally held the upper hand over the batters so far this season, but in one fell swoop the boys have shown that the new "dead ball" era is dead and that it can't be hit hard and far.

Seven major league games yesterday produced 15 home runs, well distributed among the competing teams. Rogers Hornsby, sturdy manager of the Chicago Cubs, alone exploded the yarn that the thicker cover and raised seams of the pellet used in the National league could offset the power gained through the consumption of "them steaks." The Tajah, never much of a distance hitter, added beef to his frame, clouted three home runs in succession to play the leading role in his team's 10-9 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Accounts for 8 Runs
With one single to boot, these three homers accounted for eight runs and tied the modern major league record for homers in one game. The all-time mark is four, made by Bob Lowe and Ed Delahanty back in the 90's.

The home run hitting was distributed among nine clubs, the three by Hornsby and two by Glenn Wright of Brooklyn gave the National league, with the supposedly deader ball, a 9-6 margin in the number hit. Wright's swats, one homer by Del Buevitz and another by Ed Delahanty, may prove the fore-runner to win their second game of the season, defeating the Boston Braves 6 to 1.

Simmons Finds Himself
Al Simmons, whose failure to hit has retarded the progress of the champion Philadelphia Athletics, broke loose to show the American league how to clout the ball. Simmons connected for a homer and two triples to lead the A's to a 10-7 victory over Washington.

TONY CANZONERI WINS NEW TITLE

New York Italian Holds Both Lightweight and Junior Welter Crowns

CHICAGO, Apr. 25 (AP) - Tony Canzoneri, grinning Italian from New York, has scaled pugilistic heights never before attained by a little fighter.

Little Tony, a shortener in the betting, last night fought one of the finest battles of his eventful career to wreck the drive of Jack (Kid) Berg, of England, by a stunning knockout victory in the third round of their scheduled 10-round, double-barreled title bout last night in the Chicago stadium.

Has Two Titles
The triumph over the gallant son of Great Britain preserved Canzoneri's hold on the lightweight championship of the world, and added Berg's junior welterweight crown to the Canzoneri connection.

Delirious With Happiness
The cool, calculating Canzoneri of the fight disappeared and he jumped about the ring, almost delirious with happiness. Then as he received the National Boxing association's diamond-studded championship belt from general John V. Clinch, president of the N. B. A., and chairman of the Illinois State Athletic commission, tears trickled down through his wide grin.
