Churches of City Will Have Special Services Sunday

"Motherhood" to Be Sermon Topic at Many Churches; Special Music Arranged.

As Mary, the mother of Jesus is loved, and in some faiths revered, for presenting the Saviour to the world, modern mothers will be loved and honored throughout the United States Sunday, Mother's day. This day of all the year is devoted especially to motherhood, and every man and woman should, in honor of mother and mother's love attend services on this particular day, and wear a flower in appreciation of her whom he calls mother.

"If your mother is living, and it is possible, bring her with you. If she is away from you, write her a letter, if she is gone to her reward, remember her," one local minister urges.

Services devoted to appreciation of universal motherhood are being prepared by the pastors of churches throughout the city, many of which are directed not only to young children, but to the fathers and mothers themselves.

First Presbyterian Church
Washington and Sixth Streets
Mother's Day services at the Presbyterian church Sunday morning at 11 o'clock will be devoted to an inspirational sermon on "Home is an Atmosphere," in which the minister, J. George Wain, will speak to mothers, and incidentally to fathers, he states.

"No Evil Shall Befall Thee," from "Ell," by Michael Costa, will be presented by the Ladies' Triad choir under the direction of Mrs. A. L. Richardson, and dedicated especially to the mothers of the city. The choir will sing "The Mother of My Heart," by Frank H. Grey, sung by Mrs. S. B. Morgan. Miss Gladys Miller will play the service.

The evening service will begin at 8 o'clock, and offer splendid opportunity to fellowship, the minister believes. Miss Miller will also play the evening service, and Mr. Wain will present the evening address.

Junior Christian Endeavor is scheduled for 2 o'clock, intermediate at 3 o'clock and senior at 4:30 o'clock. The day is always begun with the Sunday school session at 9:45.

Central Church of Christ

Services at the Central church of Christ Sunday morning will be built around the central theme of "Motherhood." This beautiful custom of honoring motherhood has quickly taken root in the hearts of the civilized peoples of the world, and is an appropriate means of giving emphasis to that most beautiful office.

At 11 a. m. the pastor, Rev. Paul De P. Mortimore, will speak upon the theme, "Mother." There will be special music appropriate to the day. The evening services will be a half-hour later than they have been during the winter months, making the Christian Endeavor service begin at 7 p. m.

Three societies care for every age limit of the young people and an adult prayer meeting is conducted at the same hour for older folks. The public is invited.

At 8 p. m. a service of more than usual interest is planned. Orchestra and other instrumental music will be presented in the early part of the service as well as congregational singing led by the large chorus choir.

"Mother's Day" will be observed in both services, Sunday school and church, Sunday morning. A short program given by the children of the school, will be followed with a sermon by the pastor at the eleven o'clock hour. The theme will be "Mothers of Men."

The Epworth League will begin at seven p. m. There will be no preaching service Sunday evening.

Weather Ranges From 28 to 88 Over the State
PORTLAND, May 8 (AP)—Fluctuating from below freezing to record early spring temperatures, the week ending May 5 showed several extremes, the Portland weather bureau reported.

During the period a record spring rainfall of 2.88 inches was recorded in the Wolf creek region. Several 88-degree temperature readings were recorded, as well as one of 28 above at Wallawa.

Farmers in Douglas county were cutting their first crops of alfalfa, while over in Jackson county planters watched tender shoots of sprouting corn break through the soil.

Chats With Parents
PUNISHMENT

Ideas in child training have been changing so rapidly that whereas our parents used punishment as the chief means of training, many parents today believe that it is obsolete and unnecessary.

Those who believe that human nature is wholly good feel that the guidance of love is all that is needed to develop good character.

Enlightened opinion among those who deal with large numbers of children holds that while punishment occasionally is a necessary tool of discipline, it should rightly occupy only a small place in child training.

The average child can be reared without recourse to corporal punishment; provided he is wisely and affectionately handled from the start. Every child, however, needs to feel occasional disapproval as a check to his wholly natural anti-social impulses.

Parental disapproval is sensed by the child as a temporary withdrawal of love, and he is anxious to quickly win back the affection of his parents.

Disapproval sparingly and constructively used, perhaps is the most helpful form of punishment.
