Medford Grand Jury Indicts Tom Cooper

MEDFORD, May 14 (AP)—An indictment alleging assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill, was returned by the Jackson county grand jury here yesterday against Tom H. Cooper, wanted in connection with the robbery last month of the Ashland state bank. Cooper is a fugitive. One of the two robbers was shot to death in the attempted robbery.

Another indictment was returned against Tom Hollis, former manager of the Southern Oregon Gas company of Ashland, charging larceny by embezzlement. Hollis is a brother-in-law of J. E. Albright, the dead bandit. The indictment charges his accounts were short \$2200 when he disappeared with his family.

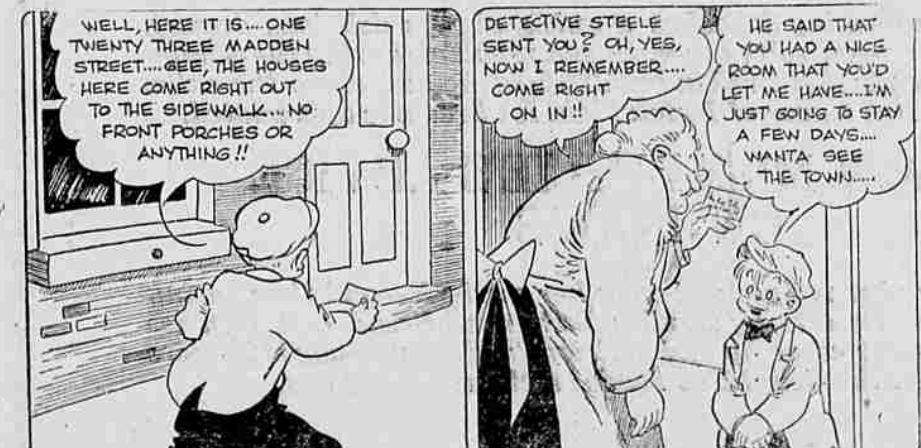

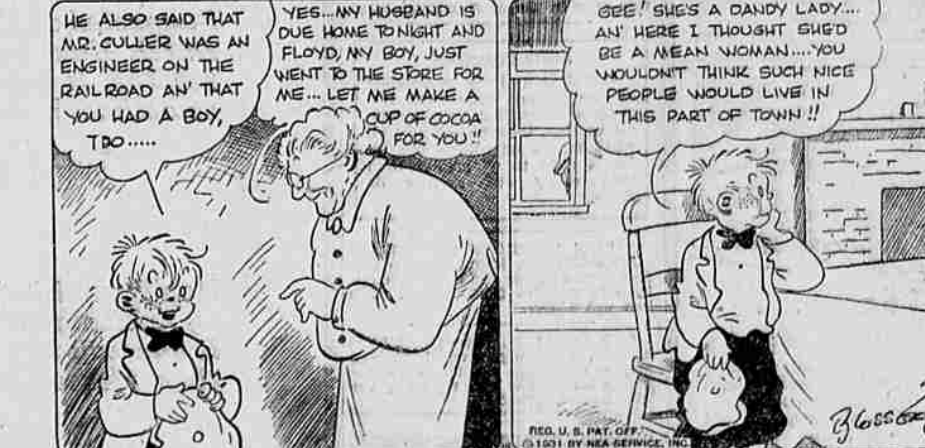

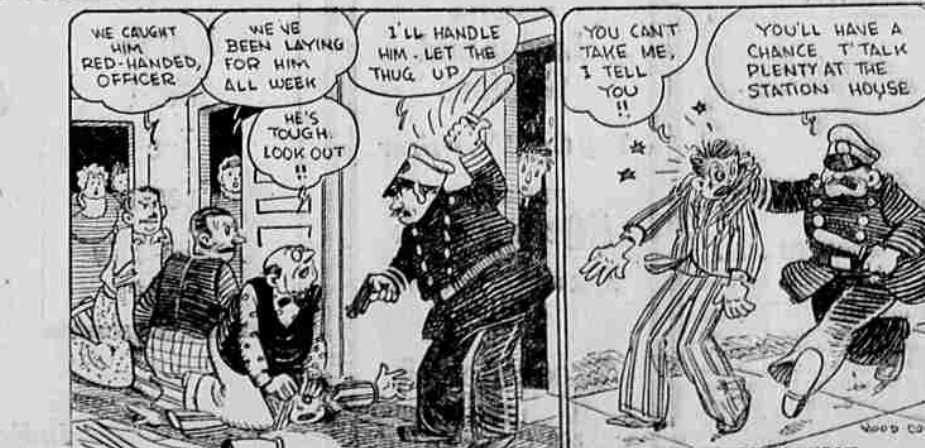
