Cooking them without water makes them more palatable, conserves more of their best qualities.

In salting meat to cook use about three-fourths of a teaspoon of salt to a pound of meat. This makes about an average seasoning.

In preparing a steak for broiling, a very small quantity of sugar sprinkled on each side of the steak will caramelize and assist in holding the juice in the meat.

The "ever ready" biscuits which were made yesterday make an ideal biscuit for a camping or similar trip, according to Miss Leslie. The dry ingredients may be mixed together as much as several days before being used, provided they are not allowed to get warm. An excellent short cake is made by using twice the amount of shortening and one egg.

There is no set rule as to the amount of liquid to be used in making biscuit dough. Some flours absorb more liquid than others do. The only safe way is to tell of the "feel." The dough should be soft enough to handle, but Miss Leslie likes hers stiff enough to knead slightly. This makes the grain of the biscuits much finer.

Broiled eggs are much more tender than eggs prepared in any other way. Another advantage is that in the ordinary broiler, about a dozen eggs can be cooked at once.
