Carry Nation's Work Recalled By Anniversary

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP)—The day when a six-foot woman wrecked the bar of the Grey hotel in Wichita, Kan., is being recalled as Kansas prepares to mark the twentieth anniversary of the death June 9, 1911, of Carry A. Nation.

The wrecking of the Carey hotel bar, December 27, 1909, officially opened the nation's career of the militant prohibitionist. Christened Carrie, the daughter of George Moore, a wealthy Kentucky landowner, the death of her first husband from the effects of drink brought a "call from God" which started Mrs. Nation on a 10-year war on alcohol.
