Canadian River

Attracts Scores Of Gold Seekers

SCOBEY, Mont., May 21 (AP) - Through this gateway into Canada a stream of American gold seekers is passing, bound for the East. Poplar is river at Coronach, Sask., 26 miles north of here, where a strike has been reported.

Reports vary widely as to the value of the properties, but possibilities have resulted in filings covering the river bottom for a distance of about 20 miles and over a breadth of about two miles.

The little town of Coronach, normally listing a population of about 400, is hard pressed to accommodate the demand for food and lodging, and the neighboring community of Pite Lake, 29 miles away, is profiting by the situation.

Reports here said about 200 claims were filed Monday and about the same number Tuesday. The Canadian land office has a special representative on the ground to handle the filings and a detachment of mounted police is preserving order.

Intense interest Monday and Tuesday night was heightened by the sight of car lights and lanterns flashing over miles of prairie, where claim seekers were endeavoring to locate corners.

Wages on Accident Commission Lower

SALEM, May 21 (AP) - The state industrial accident commission yesterday announced an equalized wage scale effecting a saving of about 10 per cent, and which affects about 100 employees of the department. The department is the first in official Oregon to announce wage reductions. The new wage is effective June 1.

In some instances the wages are reduced 20 per cent, while in other instances a slight increase was made. The commission also has under consideration the removal of its Portland office, now located at 109 1/2 Salinas, into less costly quarters. Commissioner Charles Ely said.
