KEEPING COOL. Mechanical ventilation is one of the modern comforts and public health advantages in which Europeans are willing to concede America's superiority.

Amusement houses were the first to utilize on a large scale the improved methods of air conditioning. Even on the hottest and stickiest days of mid-summer, sweet air flows through the movie palaces, providing an attraction almost as alluring as the screen program itself.

But, while mechanical ventilation has reached a high state of development, the nation has been slow in adopting it. Few public buildings possess such equipment, and it is the same with office and industrial buildings which could use it to great advantage.

On a limited scale it has been adopted by public schools of recent construction throughout the nation, although at least one state commission arrived at the conclusion that open-window ventilation is better suited to the schoolroom.

But countless colds and uncomfortable experiences tell us that, if there is any way of properly ventilating a school room or auditorium solely by the aid of windows, it has not yet been discovered.

Simplification and increased reliability will doubtless bring ventilation systems into more common use. An air conditioning plant for private homes was recently placed on the market, and may succeed in adding significance to that time-worn phrase—"all the comforts of home."

GOVERNMENTAL EFFICIENCY. The new council of personnel administration in Washington is a product of Hoover's organizing genius.

It is evidence that the chief executive considers the servants as well as those who are served. Comprising the council are the president of the federal civil service, the director of the budget bureau, and the head of the bureau of efficiency.

Collaborating with it are the chiefs of bureaus and departments. Co-ordination of all branches of the executive service to secure greater efficiency and improve the welfare of employees, as well as the development of a more effective and economical system of employment and personnel management, are expected to result.

President Hoover is working toward a system of personnel management and worker's welfare among the government employees in Washington, which will be equal or superior to the admirable systems developed in some of our great industries.

Like the public's business, which is too often nobody's business, the public servants have had few helpful friends, and they will appreciate Hoover's efforts in their behalf.

Chemists Seek Best War Gas For U.S. Use

WASHINGTON (AP)—In a laboratory at Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland, a group of chemists are working on a new gas which, in the opinion of some military leaders, the security of the nation may stand or fall.

This research organization, the only one of its kind in the United States, is seeking the best possible gas defense and offense for the army.

General Gilbert says the present army gas mask is believed the best military mask in the world, but that its weight and bulk still are more for foot troops than is desirable.

Development of masks suitable for use with optical instruments, such as range finders, is nearing completion.

Nearly a third of the casualties in the American army during the world war were due to gas, General Gilbert says. In a large number of cases it was found that the men would not put their masks on.

As far as protecting gases, both chemical and biological, are concerned he believes there have been few improvements on the types used during the world war.

Biological and chemical gases, both must be inhaled to be effective. They do not affect the body, but act on the respiratory tract. On the other hand, biological gases affect both the body and the respiratory tract, and that requires proper protective clothing, he says.

SPEAKS IN CORVALLIS

CORVALLIS, Ore., May 21 (AP)—A plea for the establishment of an efficient state police force "designed to make life safer and easier for citizens of the commonwealth" was delivered here yesterday by General Smedley D. Butler before a joint Rotary club and civic luncheon.

"A good policeman never takes sides," he said. "He enforces the laws for everybody, rich and poor alike. He must be human—not a bully and must be disciplined to control his temper and of course, must possess courage tempered with justice."

Butler said the Pennsylvania state police is an excellent example of the state as the Allegheny mountains and cited the Michigan force as an example of efficient police duty.

Every police car in Michigan, he said, is equipped with a fire extinguisher, respirator and first aid kit. In an emergency they can be converted into an ambulance.
