wages to the living victims of the World war in return for the red memorial poppies which were sold on the streets. La Grande's quota is 4000 poppies, which are being sold by the auxiliary under the leadership of Mrs. Victor Eckley. About 1200 are still to be sold and the collecting will continue Thursday, with the Camp Fire Girls canvassing the residential districts.

The poppies are made by the soldiers in the veterans' hospital in Portland, and the money made from the sale goes to the families of those veterans in Portland who are unable to support their families in any other way.

Memorial Sunday was observed at many of the churches yesterday, with sermons on appropriate subjects. Rev. W. H. Hertzog, of the Methodist church, spoke on "Memorial Day," and a quartet sang "The Boys of the Old Brigade."

Memorial day, May 30, will be the occasion to honor those who died in battle in America's wars and those who are still carrying on. All patriotic organizations are expected to participate in the celebration which begins with a parade at 10 o'clock with all patriotic organizations in uniform if possible. Norman Desilet, commander of the American Legion, announces. Complete plans will not be ready for publication until Friday, but the parade will form at a place to be designated later, and will march to the cemetery and the services will be conducted by the Grand Army of the Republic at the G. A. R. plot.
