It's been a long, hard haul for John McGraw and his New York Giants, but they finally have reached the top of the National League percentage column.

After having flirted with the leadership for a week, during which common sense at times told them they were ahead but the figures told them differently, they removed the last doubt by trimming the Boston Braves yesterday, 7 to 4, while the St. Louis Cardinals were receiving a blanking from Pittsburgh, 4 to 0.

Meine set the Cardinals down with eight scattered hits, all singles, and hang up his fourth straight victory. Meine is the only pitcher who has held the Cards scoreless this season, and he has turned the trick twice.
