PNEUMOTHORAX
In certain conditions of tuberculosis of the lungs, the injection of a gas or filtered air into the space between the chest wall and the lung, for the purpose of causing the lung to collapse and hence to remain at rest, is a valued mode of treatment.

When such adhesions form, it is not possible to secure a complete collapse of the affected lung. Hence, the presence of adhesions may make it impossible to administer pneumothorax, or may allow of only a partial collapse of the free (that is, non-adherent) portion of the lung.

MEDFORD, Ore., May 28 (AP)—Coroner E. W. Conger yesterday branded as a fantastic fabrication a story told here by a woman, about 30 years old, and purporting to be Mrs. William Stapp, that her husband, William Stapp, and Jeff Rice, both of Wenatchee, Wash., had been murdered by highwaymen near Eureka, Cal.

Nothing is known of the woman who spread the story. She left Medford last night. Conger said after searching for a chance acquaintance in a boarding house, leaving her bill unpaid.

NEW YORK, May 28 (AP)—Newspapers are credited with important aid to the Better Business Bureau of New York City in the bureau's report for the year ending April 30, 1931.

Several of the city's newspapers refused to accept advertising from two real estate operators who were using "free lunch and lecture" bait. Another barred the advertisements offering to obtain mortgages for an advance fee.

One advertiser who used false telegrams in the newspaper copy, told the bureau in defense that they were "merely advertising propaganda."

Air Armada Honors Gold Star Mothers

S. S. PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT, May 28 (AP)—The American army's air armada, flying in maneuvers off the New Jersey coast, saluted the party of Gold Star mothers and widows who sailed yesterday for France aboard the President Roosevelt, as the liner moved out to sea.

Every means of transmitting news to the world were employed by the press, newsreels, representatives and radio broadcasters, through the aid of army authorities, in sending out full information about the activities of the great air armada. He news representatives, both reporters and photographers, flew with the armada in order to get first hand stories and pictures.

A reporter and photographer from each newspaper flew in a special squadron of planes taking the place of the mechanics. The press planes took off from Ford-Landing airport and led the procession. Newsreel men strapped the tripods of their cameras where machine guns would be ordinarily, and shots of the parade and the hundreds of thousands along the lake shore were made while the planes sped along at an average speed of 100 miles an hour.

At the moment ten big photographic ships took the air. Their mission was to fly above and below the planes in formation to record in pictures the story of the maneuvers. These planes carried their dark rooms into the air with them, their photographers ready to hand out prints when they landed.

The air maneuvers climaxed Chicago's jubilee celebration which has been the biggest local event since the ex-harshar congress, as far as daily news play is concerned.

For him, boxing gloves are a civilizing influence. For father or uncle or the gym teacher, whoever it is that teaches him to use them, will teach him that there are rules to the game and that he must fight fair and keep his temper when he is beaten. The naturally timid boy who for one reason or another is something of a physical coward may be helped to overcome his fearfulness through being taught the art of boxing. He learns to defend himself in the spirit of the game, acquiring gradually a little necessary aggressiveness and a new feeling of self-assurance which enables him to hold his own as he never could do before. There is something particularly valuable to the boy in having his father the one who teaches him how to box. Every boy feels a certain amount of resentment against his father for the authority he exercises and the omnipotence he represents. Landing a few good blows against him does the boy a world of good. He feels less inferior, less insignificant, while he enjoys being on an equal footing with the person he admires most. Wealth Needs Wisdom—"Wise men accumulate wealth," said Mr. H.
