ANGORA (P)—The first statue in Turkey's capital to anyone other than Mustafa Kemal has been ordered erected in honor of the police force. It will show a huge figure of a policeman, and the funds are to come from the various towns and cities of the republic in proportion to their size. Istanbul's share will be \$10,000.

Foreign observers, noting the number of the ever-present police in Turkey, have dubbed the Kemalist regime a "policeocracy."
