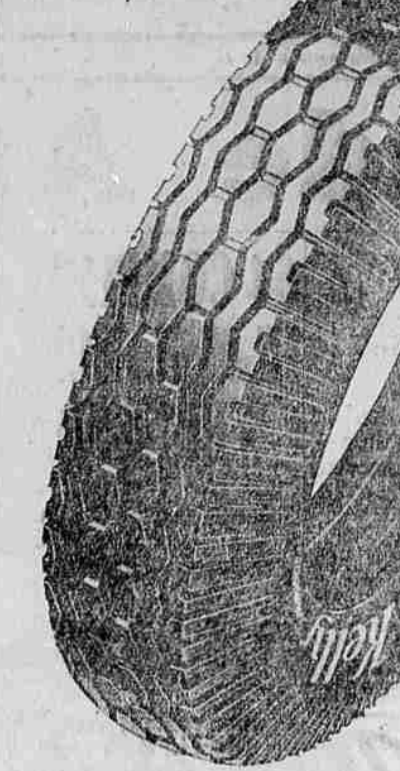
Fred Kramer, Of Pendleton, Will Coach In Eugene
