Meehan Resigns As Head Coach At New York U.

NEW YORK, Dec. 14 (AP)—John P. (Chick) Meehan has resigned as head football coach at New York university.

His formal announcement of resignation had tersely that he desired that "no consideration be given to the renewal of his contract, added that he did not desire to involve either his friends and associates at New York university or the team members in "any controversy" and declared he had made no coaching plans for 1932.

Neither Chancellor Elmer E. Brown nor other officials at New York university would comment. They said an official statement by the school would be prepared later.

Although there was no official confirmation, it was understood that opposition to Meehan's retention as coach had developed within the board of athletic control. For months there have been rumors that he would not be with the university in 1932.

Later it was understood that difficulties had been ironed out and that he would be asked to sign a one-year contract at a salary somewhat smaller than the \$18,000 he is understood to have received under the terms of the three-year contract which expires Dec. 31.

Recently the New York university student publication, Daily News, printed an attack on Meehan asking that he be not retained.

The attack was based on what the paper called his connection with "big-time football."

"We do not want Mr. Meehan," the paper said, "because Mr. Meehan stands for a university policy of 'big-time' football, with all its corollary evils, recruiting of players, lavish entertainment of prospects, sub-
