HEAVY SEAS TAKE THREE OREGONIANS

(Continued From Page One) guard lookout at Coos bay marvelled that they got safely to sea.

About 3 p. m., the lookout observed the smack attempting to come in. Even before the boat was in distress, the lookout sent the coast guard cutter Coos Bay to help it in.

The cutter, Captain A. E. Holst commanding, was within 100 yards of the Comet when a huge breaker struck both vessels. The cutter itself turned over twice, then grounded against the beach. B. H. Clark, coast guardman, was swept overboard, but just as the boat struck the shore the other guardmen threw him a life line, which he caught some 50 yards from the boat.

The three fishermen were washed to sea by the breaker. The guardmen were no sooner beached than they ran out on the jetty only a few yards away and attempted to locate the bodies, but without success. They had not been recovered at a late hour last night.

Worst Accident Since 1923 An emergency coast guard boat was sent out to rescue the guardmen from the jetty. None of the guardmen was injured. The cutter was badly damaged, to the extent of about \$10,000.

Captain Holst said it was the worst accident in Coos Bay since 1923 when the Captain O. A. Smith went ashore with 10 lives lost half a mile from the present wreck.
