Collins said he resented "attention" the 22-year-old daughter of Dr. A. L. Hickok, head of the prison psychopathic ward, had given another negro prisoner, Henry Malone. Both were inmates employed as servants in the Hickok home.

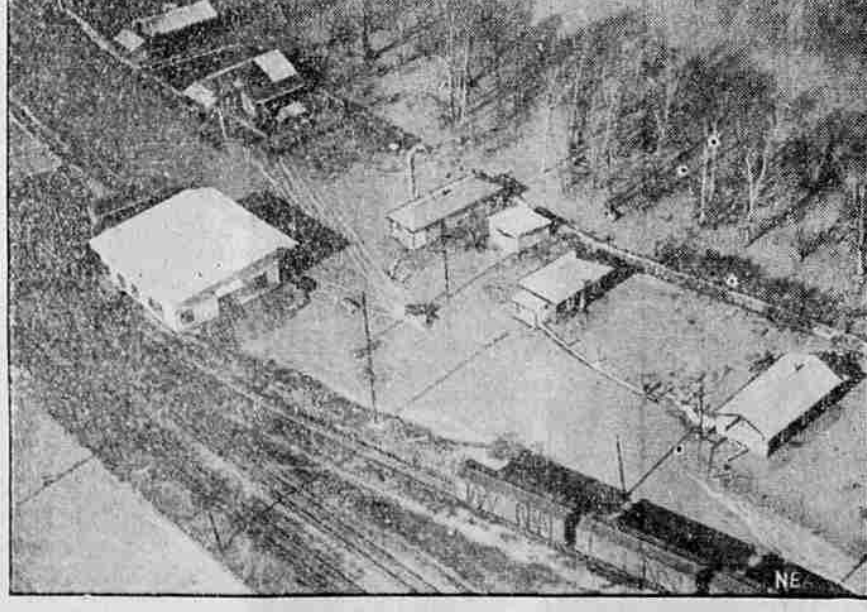
