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This Game of Golf

The death of Sol Metzger, at the age of 51, removed from the field of sports writing a distinguished figure, and cost me one of the best friends I have known and worked with in the game.

It was in a sort of collaboration with Mr. Metzger between eight and nine years ago that I undertook the collection of "best shot" anecdotes from the leaders in golf.

We turned up some odd and whimsical tales, Mr. Metzger and I—not all of them, by the way, precisely to be catalogued as fine golf shots, but none the less entertaining.

There was the second-shot by Mr. Sylvanus P. Jermain, the beloved "Father of Golf in Toledo," played for the famous doglegged seventh hole at Inverness, where our national open was contested last summer.

Mr. Jermain, on this occasion, was competing with a youthful giant, an ex-football star, who drove huge distances but not invariably in the correct line. Mr. Jermain plugging steadily away, had him two down with three to play as they stood on the seventh tee—they had started their match on the second nine.

'Cushion' Shot Here it appeared the giant would get back a hole, for his drive was far over the intervening valley and the trees, leaving him a wee pitch to the small green, while Mr. Jermain had sliced his ball well off line and was left at the wrong side of the angle, a full spoon shot away, against the wind.

Mr. Jermain hit that spoon shot as hard as he could—harder, it would seem; and the ball, caught near the toe of the club, went away with a vast hook, headed straight over the bluff into the valley below.

But at the edge of the declivity and not far from the green, grazed an elderly white horse. The ball, curving more and more, struck him squarely abaft, you might say—and a real cushion-shot bounded high in the air, arcing toward the green, landed on the putting surface, and trickled up dead for a birdie three—and the match!

Lawford With Niblick

Then, I remember, we dug up the story of Francis Oulmet's purposefully topped niblick shot from a deep bunker, in a Scottish foursome played back in 1933 at Rye, in England.

The second shot of Oulmet's partner had put their ball in a bunker with a nearly vertical face, a hundred yards from the green. Their opponents' ball was well on in two. A blast would do nothing much, so Francis tried a trick shot. Working his feet firmly into the sand, he swung with all his power, catching the ball with the edge of the big niblick blade as it started coming up.

Up came the ball, just grazing the top of the bunker, ducked like an old-fashioned Lawford in tennis, came to the turf—and ran like a rabbit.

The terrific overpin, administered by the niblick's blade, which had cut through the cover, carried it on to the green and close enough for Oulmet's partner to sink a most unusual four, while the naturally startled opponents took three putts and lost a hole they seemed sure to win.

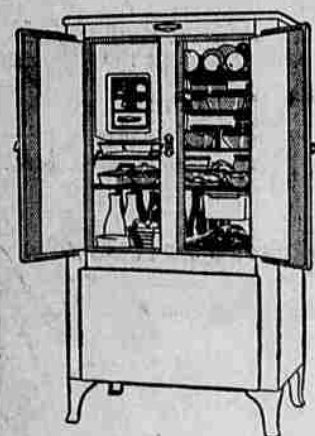
