Will Rogers At Home To Share In "This Dough"

NEW YORK, Feb. 9.—Will Rogers, who wisecracked his way around the world, arrived today from Europe on the liner Europa "to get in on this dough everybody is going to dig out of their sock."

"I hear they are making a drive against hoarding," he said, "and I don't want to be away under the circumstances."

In Europe, he said, when you're introduced to somebody they say "Glad to meet you, cancel the debts." He saw the opening of the disarmament conference and it was "like the Folies, only harder to get in. All the diplomats were selling seats." He said Andrew Mellon would be a very popular ambassador to Great Britain. "He's got enough money to be popular anywhere."

Rogers revealed he had offered to be Ray Long, publisher, that Hoover would be president but Mrs. Rogers admitted the money wasn't in sight as the crucial moment. The humorist, in fine fettle, insisted upon dragging all by standers into the picture as photographers snatched him, and emitted a steady stream of questions.

"How is my friend Jack Garner going? That's a soft job because the speaker don't do anything and don't get to say nothing."

"Tell me about Alfalfa Bill Murray of Oklahoma. There's a boy for you who may be president. With this deadlock and all, Bill may sneak in. He's a 30-to-1 shot now but he'll come up. I'm sneaking in with Bill."

"Everywhere I went a war broke out just after I left. Say, ain't these Chinese putting up a battle. I flew hundreds of miles with a Chinese pilot, which is taking more chances than Lindbergh took. I flew over Jerusalem and though I didn't stop I could hear the walling. That was an amateur walling, however, compared to what I heard as soon as the ship came within earshot of Nantucket light."

"I guess I'm the only gent who went to Cairo without seeing the sphinx. I had already seen Mr. Coolidge. The most interesting guy I met on the trip, during which I flew 12 days steady from near Singapore to London, was a fellow taking 500 cases of bees to China. I'd like to hear from that fellow. I'm going back home to Hollywood to make some pictures. Am I going to write a short history of China? Yes, very short."

Steve Carrigan, trainer of thoroughbreds at the winter training track for race horses here, has subdued the star fire-eater that gave jockeys, starters and trainers much trouble in the east last year.

immediately taken to her cell after hearing the verdict read. Her first act there was to walk in front of her mirror where she stood gazing into her own eyes for several seconds.

Guards Placed

Sheriff J. R. McFadden ordered a day and night guard be maintained in the woman's cell, fearing that some attempt might be made by Mrs. Judd to end her life.

Before the state may hang Mrs. Judd, an appeal is mandatory under Arizona law. The defense counsel said the appeal would be made soon after sentence is pronounced on Feb. 23. County Attorney Lloyd J. Andrews stated he would take the initiative in event the defense requested. His action would be for certification of the evidence.

Mrs. Judd is the second woman ever to be condemned to the gallows by a jury in Arizona. Mrs. Eva Duman was hanged in 1930 for the murder of A. J. Mathis, aged referee of Tucson.

Husband With Her

Mrs. Judd had only her middle-aged husband, Dr. William C. Judd, Los Angeles physician, at her side when the verdict was read. Her parents, Rev. and Mrs. Harvey Joy McKinnell of Darlington, Ind., had returned for the night, and her brother, Burton McKinnell, was absent from the courtroom when the jury announced it was ready with its verdict.

Tears welled into Dr. Judd's eyes as the jury's decision was announced. He has remained loyal to his wife throughout her troubles.

"This fight," said Paul Schenck, chief defense attorney, "has just begun. Ninety-one persons, including Mrs. Judd, have pledged their lives in my care during my career. Ninety-one of them are still alive tonight."
