

Union Club Will Hold Clam Feed Next Thursday

UNION (Special) — Sportsmen of Eastern Oregon are making extensive plans for the annual clam feed to be held on Thursday of next week at the club house. They are anticipating a crowd of about 150, including the members of the state game commission, and in order to take care of the crowd they have decided to enlarge the club house. Several sportsmen are donating their services for this work and they will have it ready for the "feed." Other work about the hatchery will be under way soon, as the commission has ordered that a new floor, hatching troughs and new tank replace the old ones. Final plans have not been completed but the outlook toward the hatchery remaining in Union appears favorable.

The members of the Carnation club drove to La Grande Thursday for their regular meeting and took in the show "Street Scene" in the afternoon. Those who went were Mesdames Walter G. Cook, Edith E. Busick, G. F. Hall, George Hoffman, C. E. Lawson, S. E. Miller, G. A. Scribner, Alice Cadwell and P. B. Conner. Dr. Luce, of Hot Lake, accompanied by G. I. Hess and R. H. Bonney, drove up Catherine creek Tuesday, with a moving picture camera and took several pictures of the deer that come down to the feeding grounds. Mr. Bonney states that about 200 deer gather at the two feeding points, the rock crusher and the ice cave, at 4 o'clock each day. It doesn't take a great deal of hay to satisfy them but they are ready for their daily "dole."

A shipment of 300,000 Eastern Brook trout eggs arrived at the hatchery from East Lake near Bend last week.

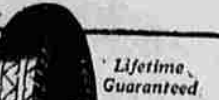

Ritchie Urges No Cut Be Made In U.S. Armed Forces

BALTIMORE, Feb. 12 (AP) — Governor Albert C. Ritchie Thursday called on the United States to maintain adequate armed forces "to protect the nation in the face of a world giving every indication of preparing for another war."

Standing at the foot of the first monument erected in honor of George Washington, the Maryland executive and Democratic presidential candidate issued his plea over a nationwide radio system in opening Maryland's celebration of the Washington bicentennial.

Declaring the armed forces of the nation now are far below the provisions of the national defense act, he pleaded not to weaken them further.

"A military system adequate for our national defense threatens nobody, but it does assure safety to our people and our possessions, due regard for our self-respect and neutrality and our effectiveness as a factor for world peace," he said.

Seek Repeal Of Anderson Dry Law

SALEM, Feb. 12 (AP) — The first completed initiative petition was filed with the secretary of state Thursday by Harry B. Critchlow, when 18,808 signers were secured for the repeal of the Anderson dry law act. The repeal measure will now appear on the November election ballot and voted upon by the Oregon electorate. The law provides the signature of 17,088 registered voters.

Critchlow, who presented the signatures here in person, said of the names secured, 12,063 were signed up in Portland while 6,745 were signed outside of Portland. Thirty-three counties were represented by the petitions.

TWAS WARTIME DEVICE SAYS FRENCH HISTORIAN

PARIS (AP) — The cigarette has its century this year, says a French writer who dwells in the by ways of history.

It was at the siege of Acre, in Syria, in 1322, the besieging artillerymen received a supply of tobacco, but the boxes of pipes which accompanied it were smashed by cannon balls and there was no way of smoking it.

In those days gunners primed their pieces with powder enclosed in little tubes of India paper. One of the soldiers substituted tobacco for gunpowder and the cigaret was born. Cigarets were fairly common in London in 1840, were introduced into France in 1845, and into Italy in 1850.

FISH CLOG GERMAN RIVER

CUXHAVEN, Germany (AP) — Fishermen returning from the annual herring harvest in the North Sea report the Elbe estuary clogged at times by huge schools of the fish. The boats were loaded to the gunwales and herring sold for a cent apiece.

Uruguay Derides Charge Country Shields Red Nest

MONTEVIDEO (AP) — Neither the Uruguayan government, nor Uruguayans, the Russian trading organization which makes its South American headquarters here, is worried by allegations from other countries that Uruguay is the fountainhead of a stream of communist propaganda that is tingling South America red.

Chilean charges that communists in Uruguay inspired and helped to finance the December revolt in Copalpo; Peruvian suspicions that communists here know all about the inner workings of the Aprista which has caused frequent trouble there; Argentine irritation that the Iuyamtoro, expelled from Buenos Aires six months ago, should find hospice over the river in Montevideo—all these are regarded in Uruguay as nonsense.

Welcomes Exiles
Uruguay has long been a congenial place for those who have, for one reason or another, left their native countries.

Exiles from Argentina, Brazil, and other Latin American republics enter without annoyance. Montevideo has become the home of many South

American as well as European communists.

"In so small a country," Minister of Interior Eugenio told The Associated Press, "it is easy for our authorities to watch the communist centers. The police know all their doings. We know their activities never go beyond the ideologist or cultural fields."

"On the other hand the communists understand that the tolerance shown them would cease the moment they would wrong use of the country's freedom."

Few Uruguayan Reds
"As for Uruguay itself—in a chamber of deputies with 123 members only two belong to the communist party and it has no connection with the communist party of the soviet republics."

Alexis Minkin, president of Iuyamtoro, said the activities of his organization are purely commercial. Funds of Iuyamtoro, Mr. Minkin said, deposited in the Bank of Uruguay, government-controlled, and allied institutions, and are so supervised that large sums could not be sent to other countries without knowledge of governmental authorities.

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'Bud' Stillman To Devote Life And Fortune To Charity

BOSTON, Feb. 12 (AP) — The Boston American in a copyrighted story says that James A. "Bud" Stillman, Harvard medical student and heir to a huge fortune, had pledged his life as a doctor to service among the poor. The American says that after his graduation in June he will devote his career as obstetrician and specialist in women's ills to charitable work among the patients of free institutions and that his fortune, perhaps, as well as his career is so dedicated.

"Bud," the newspaper continues, is a daily attendant at the clinic of the free hospital for women, in Brookline, studying among patients to whom luxury is only a word.

All of his practical application to the problems of medicine and surgery, outside his attendance at Harvard, has been among "free" patients, the American says. He was attached to the city hospital for three months before beginning his study at the Brookline institution.

Officials at the city hospital, the American relates, said that Stillman is a promising doctor; that he possesses qualifications which make for success in medicine—patience, tact and understanding and the rare gift of sympathy.

He never asked favors of hospital authorities, the paper says. To his patients his name meant nothing. That he was the son of the New York banker and Mrs. Pifi Fowler McCormick they were unaware.
