

Pope, Mussolini Seal Peace Pact At Italian Meet

By John Evans (Copyright, 1932, By the Associated Press) VATICAN CITY, Feb. 12 (AP)—Premier Benito Mussolini, Il Duce of Italian fascism, and Pope Pius XI, holy father to the Catholic world, met today in the papal library at the Vatican for the first time and were closeted alone for a full hour, sealing the peace of the church and state which was begun by the Lateran treaty three years ago.
