Chill. Serve on lettuce or vegetable salad.

New Footwear

2 cups flour 3 teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt 4 tablespoons sugar 4 tablespoons fat 2-3 cup milk Mix flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Out in fat with knife. Mixing with knife, add milk. When soft dough forms, pat it out on a floured board or paper. The dough should be 1-3 inch thick. Spread with berry mixture. Roll tightly and place in greased baking pan. Bake 25 minutes in moderate oven. While warm, cut in slices and serve.

BRITISH WARN BOTH SIDES LONDON, Feb. 18 (AP)—Through the minister to China who is now at Shanghai the British government has warned the Chinese government that either side—China or Japan—will be held strictly responsible for acts such as the fatal wounding two British sailors yesterday when shells from the Chapel sector dropped in the international settlement.

It was requested that the Chinese military authorities be given strict instructions to avoid further incidents of that character. No further action in connection with the death of the two men is contemplated here and it is assumed that the incident will be settled by payment of indemnity to the sailors' families.
