'Twas a very delightful St. Patrick party that Mrs. Edith Phipps gave for the members of the Carnation club and a guest or two on Thursday.

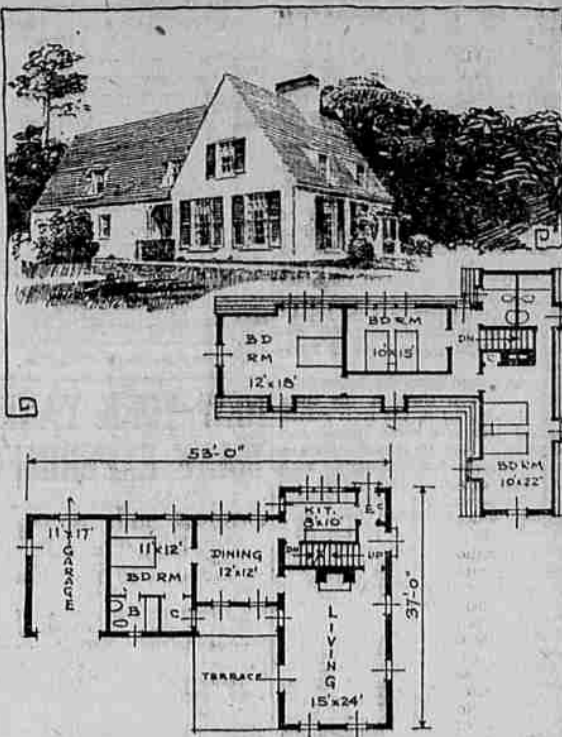
