Those who have followed recent trends of research and study in medicine as reported in scientific publications or in the lay press must have been impressed with the frequent mention of the term virus.

We have heard of the virus of poliomyelitis or infantile paralysis, of influenza, of the common cold, and even of the "Spanish" influenza.

At times, in popular reports of these studies, the term virus is used as a synonym of germ or microbe, and frequently the two are interchangeable.

To the scientist, however, the term virus, and particularly filtrable virus, indicates a disease-causing agent differing in many essential respects from germs or microorganisms.

Science frequently is handicapped by its terminology. When confronted with new situations, substances or ideas in order to give them a name it must coin new terms, or employ old ones in a new sense.

Then as further knowledge is gained it is not uncommon to find the term originally used to designate the new matter a misfit.
