Coombs Sees Big Baseball Future For College Men

DURHAM, N. C. (AP)—In the future more big leaguers will be entitled to write "A. B." after their names, in the opinion of John W. "Jack" Coombs, Duke university baseball coach.

Coombs believes the slump in the minor leagues will force the majors to turn to the colleges with added persistence after new talent.

"Five years ago," he says, "there were almost 50 organized baseball leagues. This year it is doubtful if 20 will start the season with teams."

Major league clubs must get their players somewhere so it is his opinion that they will instruct their scouts to follow those college teams which have promising material.

"The chain-store" plan is coming fast, but until this system is firmly established, college graduates will go first to the clubs not having the system."

Baseball Education Coombs said boys with some ball playing ability are enrolling in colleges now because they figure it is the first step to a major league contract.

Many are making baseball their life's vocation, he added, and they will try to make a scientific study of the game, now being in the curriculum work of some universities.

Coaches conduct the baseball coaching school at Duke, and last spring 145 candidates came out for the freshman team. These were cut to 40, but others had the opportunity of playing intramural baseball.

Investigations covering the whole state of New Jersey, New York state, Long Island, Philadelphia and various parts of Pennsylvania have not as yet disclosed his whereabouts.

Harry Fleischer, also a known kidnaping and involved in the Price kidnaping in Connecticut, has been unaccounted for since the kidnaping.

An unsubstantiated report associates Able Wagner with Harry Fleischer. Every effort is being made to locate Harry Fleischer so he may be questioned concerning his whereabouts prior to and at the time of the kidnaping.

Funds "Sadly Depleted"

So hard, in fact, that Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf, state police head, told the budget commission his department's funds have been "sadly depleted."

The police expenditures started leaping upward the month Col. Lindbergh phoned for aid after he found the child's crib empty March 1.

Now Col. Schwarzkopf is curtailing costs. Food for the troopers is cooked at a police barracks and some of the many telephones have been removed from headquarters in the Lindbergh garage. An emergency appropriation may be asked.

REPORTED IN "CHESAPEAKE BAY"

NORFOLK, Va., Mar. 24 (AP)—The Ledger Dispatch said today that Charles A. Lindbergh Jr., 20-month-old son of the famous aviator, kidnaped from his parents' home in New Jersey more than three weeks ago, is reported on a yacht "somewhere in Chesapeake bay."

The paper said three representative Norfolk citizens motored to the Soudland mountain estate of the Lindberghs Tuesday night and yesterday interviewed Colonel and Mrs. Lindbergh.

The visit of the Norfolk men to New Jersey was to secure assent of the colonel to plans for the return of the baby, involving the payment of a substantial ransom, the paper says.

CONTINUE INVESTIGATIONS

CHICAGO, March 24 (AP)—H. Caldwell, member and former president of the board of education, upon returning home from the east last night said he would continue his private investigation into the kidnaping of Charles Augustus Lindbergh Jr., in Chicago and was hopeful the out-

come would be "satisfactory."

He declined to say what information he had, but declared it was considered important by "the officials." He admitted spending three days and several evenings on the estate of Col. Lindbergh at Hopewell but said he was told by Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf that "the less said of your visit and information the better."

MARTIN DEPEW MENTION

BLOOMSBURG, Pa., March 24 (AP)—Kansas City detectives, seeking Martin Depew in connection with the kidnaping of Mrs. Nell Donnelly, said today they had information which indicated connections between the Donnelly case and the kidnaping of the Lindbergh baby.

Detectives Robert Cole and Joseph Brennan have been working in Pennsylvania for several months, tracing all clues regarding Depew whose wife is detained at Kansas City after being arrested here.

The selection of Ossie Solem as head football coach at the University of Iowa will meet with the approval of football men the country over.

The big, genial coach of the Drake Bulldogs has built up, in his 11 years at Des Moines, a reputation for training out smart teams. With a student body of less than 800 men from which to draw Solem has never had a really poor team and some of his squads have been of big league calibre.

Tad Sloane went from Drake to stardom at the Naval academy several years ago.

Solem is a graduate of the Williams school of football at the University of Minnesota, but he teaches a game that combines the best elements of several well-known systems, with the Notre Dame tactics the most prominent. He was a great friend of the late Knute Rockne, the game between Drake and the Irish being an annual fixture.

In moving over to Iowa City, only a few miles east of Des Moines, Solem will be going to ground almost as famous as his university.

With three years in which to show results, Ossie should have the Hawkeyes back on the football map before his contract runs out.

He has a student body of some 8000 from which to gather recruits, an embarrassment of riches compared to his Drake squad.

CRISLER'S HANDS FREE

The selection of Tad Wieman as Fritz Crisler's assistant and line coach at Princeton university indicates the new Tiger manager is being given all the encouragement possible in selecting a staff to help him put the Tigers back in the football picture.

Wieman was line coach under Crisler at Minnesota for two years and before that a player, assistant coach and head coach at the University of Michigan.

It is said the University of Minnesota would have kept him as athletic director, but he apparently preferred to go along with Crisler and stake his reputation, with that of his chief's, on their ability to turn out a winning team at old Nassau.

RANGERS FOREVER

Taking a turn around the hockey rink, I learn that the New York Rangers' greatest line has been Bun Cook and Frank Boucher—March 17 played their 300th game together since starting with the Rangers in 1926. Over combinations of this kind are not so frequent, but the Cooks and Boucher seem destined to run on forever.

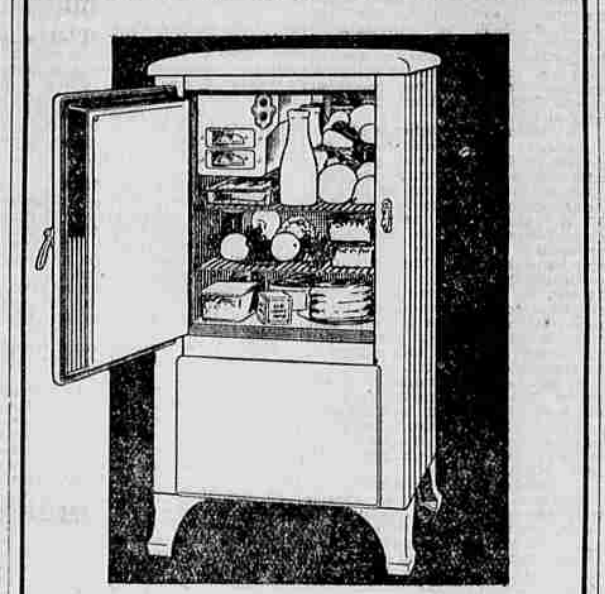
Minus some of the fire which made them a central force to other teams in other years they still remain a fine scoring combination and the most polished front line in the National league.
