WASHINGTON, Apr. 14 (AP)—Eugene Meyer, governor of the federal reserve board, told a house banking sub-committee today he thought issuance of \$2,400,000,000 in currency to pay the soldiers bonus would be "unwise" and "harm the government's credit not only abroad but at home."
