Highway Official Of Idaho Now On Trial at Lewiston

LEWISTON, Ida., Apr. 27 (AP)—Noel B. Martin, prosecution counsel, outlining the state's case against Henry Gusman, charged that Gusman, conspired with Ben Kane, Coeur d'Alene, and Herbert Potech, Lewiston, to "rob the state of Idaho systematically" by accepting orders and payments for machinery parts for the highway department and then failing to deliver them.

Aviation Shows Big Gain in 1931 In Spite of Economic Conditions

While many other industries showed a decline during 1931, such was not the case in the field of aviation. Civil aircraft in the United States carried 2,380,882 passengers and flew 141,729,107 miles during the year in all types of operations. The scheduled air lines, including domestic routes and American operated lines extending into Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, carried 522,345 passengers in 1931, and the miles flown were 47,985,987. The remainder of the flying activity was credited to miscellaneous operators.

Land of Agriculturists

Ninety per cent of Ecuador's population is estimated to be dependent in some measure on agriculture for its living. There was a substantial increase in traffic over the scheduled airlines in 1931 over 1930, but activities of miscellaneous operators decreased.
