

Huge Field Figures To Leave Barrier In Kentucky Derby

NUMBER HORSES STARTING TO BE DECIDED SHORTLY

Depends on Showing of Favorites in Tests Leading to Churchill Downs Classic.

By Otto Robertson (Associated Press Sports Writer) NEW YORK, Apr. 28 (AP)—One of the largest fields in the history of the Kentucky Derby probably will see the barrier for the fifty-eighth running of the \$50,000 stake at Churchill Downs, May 7.

Much depends, however, on what the three future book favorites—C. V. Whitney's Top Flight, Max Loomis' Burnin' Blue and the Seaboard Farm's Burning Blue—show in their three-year-old debuts.

Top Flight and Tick On are slated to appear in public appearances at the former in the \$10,000 Wood Memorial at Jamaica and the latter in the \$10,000 Chesapeake Stakes at Havre de Grace, Md., on May 1.

So far the railbirds are pretty much in the air. Top Flight, under the watchful eye of Tom Healey, has been working steadily at Belmont Park, turning in several miles of better than 1:45 and one in 1:42 under light restraint.
