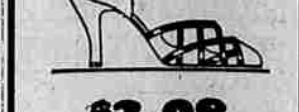

All classes were extremely depressed at the weekend. Best spring lambs were quoted to \$6.50 with bulk hitting \$4.00-\$6.25; strictly choice old crop fed lambs were quoted to \$5.00, but bulk sales were \$3.50-\$4.25 and less; ewes showed a spread of 50c-\$2.00.
