

Olympic Games Open At Los Angeles July 30

TRACK EVENTS TO BE HELD IN OPENING WEEK

Field Events Scheduled For Aug. 7 — Japan's Highly Schooled Horses to Arrive Tomorrow.

Formal opening of the Olympic games at Los Angeles will be held on July 30, according to a synopsis of the program received by the Observer. The formal opening will take place in the stadium and the only other event that day will be weightlifting, scheduled for the afternoon. The games will continue through Sunday, Aug. 14, when equestrian jumps will complete the schedule. Highlights of the two weeks include: Track events the afternoon of July 31, Aug. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6. Field events the afternoon of Aug. 7. American football, the evening of Aug. 8.

JAPANESE HORSES ARRIVE LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 10 (AP)—As a forerunner of the equestrian

of 400 athletes, coaches and trainers May 30, 12 of Japan's highest schooled horses will arrive at Los Angeles harbor tomorrow to be trained here for the equestrian events of the Olympic games.

Major Sumino Kido, a cavalry officer, is in charge of the animals, with eight hostlers also making the trip. The riders are expected on another trans-Pacific liner May 30 with the rest of the team of 140 athletes. The remainder of the large group from Nippon are officials, trainers and coaches.

The equestrian events come near the finish of the games, lasting from the tenth to the fourteenth of August. The country has even entered in the cosmopolitan classic and indicates that much of the competition expected by the United States, not only in the equestrian, but also in the swimming, track and field, and other events, will come from the Far East.

CARL REYNOLDS HITS FAST PACE

Washington "Bargain" Leading Both Leagues With .420 Slugging.

By Gayle Talbot (Associated Press Sports Writer) It hasn't taken Carl Reynolds long to combine his new employers, the Washington Senators, that they drove a very brisk bargain when they obtained him from the Chicago White Sox in one of the winter's most discussed deals.

The speedy outfielder, who joined the Senators in a trade involving two veteran pitchers, Sam Jones and Irving Hawley, is in no small measure responsible for the fact that Walter Johnson's outfit is leading its closest American league rivals by three full games today.

Reynolds virtually was the whole reason for the Senators' success yesterday's opener from Cleveland, 3 to 0. He scored the first run off Wes Ferrell in the seventh, when he singled, scored his way around to third and went home on an infield out. His homerun in the next frame with Joe Cronin aboard settled any doubt of the issue.

Lloyd Brown continued to pitch sparkling ball for the leaders, allowing only four hits and walking three. The victory was Washington's eighth in ten starts.

live of Oberlin, Ohio, son of Rev. James Brand, D. D. He married Irene M. Morley in Cleveland, Ohio and they have two children. He is a graduate of Oberlin college. Judge Brand came to Oregon in 1909, worked on a ranch near Roseburg and later joined the United States forest service. He returned to his studies in 1911 and in 1914 graduated from Harvard law school. He entered law practice at Roseburg in 1914 and continued until 1927. He served as president of the chamber of commerce, president of the Coos County Good Roads association, chairman of the school board, city attorney for ten years and vice president of the league of Oregon cities.

He was appointed circuit judge by Governor Patterson in 1927. Judge Brand received the Republican-Democratic nomination in 1928 and was elected judge in the second judicial district without opposition. An active member of the judicial council he has drafted several measures for the improvement and tightening up of criminal procedure. They were approved by vote of the judges. He is the author of a treatise on "The Insanity Defense."

The Coos County Bar association recently issued a resolution strongly endorsing Judge Brand for the position.
