

Idaho Bankers Are Indicted On Three Charges

MOSCOW, Idaho, May 12 (AP)—The federal grand jury yesterday indicted Joseph Keefe, president, and J. Albert Keefe, cashier, of the closed Twin Falls, Idaho, National bank, charging them with false entry, falsification of reports and misappropriation of funds.

The secret indictments accused the bankers on three counts: false entries in books of the bank, false reports to the comptroller of the currency and misappropriation of funds of the bank.

The period during which the alleged irregularities were said to have occurred was given as December, 1930, to the closing of the bank November 21, 1931.

The two men will be arraigned at the next term of federal court in Pocatello next October. United States Attorney H. E. Ray said, and no one connected with the court would divulge further information about the charges.

DEPOSITS LISTED
TWIN FALLS, Idaho, May 12 (AP)—Deposits of the Twin Falls National bank at the time of its closing last November 23 were given as \$206,000. This compared with deposits of \$266,481 at the last previous bank call, September 30.

In a statement issued when the bank was closed, J. R. Bothwell, attorney for the bank, said the directors considered the suspension advisable because of a lack of liquid assets to meet current demands, and that it was hoped a temporary suspension would relieve the situation.

CHICKEN PIE USERS, LEFTOVERS
A Dinner Menu
Chicken Pie Buttered Asparagus
Bread Lettuce Salad
Celery Seed Dressing
Chocolate Sponge Cake Coffee

Chicken Pie, Serving 6
4 tablespoons butter
4 tablespoons flour
2 cups milk or stock
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon paprika
2 tablespoons chopped parsley
2 tablespoons chopped celery
1 tablespoon chopped pimientos
1 1/2 cups diced cooked chicken
1/2 cup cooked peas

Melt butter. Add flour. Add milk and cook until creamy sauce forms. Stir constantly. Add rest of ingredients. Pour into shallow buttered baking dish.
Crust
2 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
5 tablespoons fat
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
Mix flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in fat with knife. Mixing with knife, add egg and milk. Toss soft dough onto floured board or paper. Pat out dough until 1/4 inch thick. Cut into 1 1/2 inch squares. Arrange on top chicken mixture. Bake 20 minutes in moderate oven. Serve in dish in which baked.

Celery Seed Dressing
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon paprika
1 teaspoon dry mustard
1 teaspoon onion juice
6 tablespoons sugar
5 tablespoons lemon juice
1 cup salad oil
1 teaspoon celery seed
Mix ingredients in wide mouthed bottle. Cork and shake for several minutes. Chill. When ready to use, shake bottle well and pour over the salad ingredients which have been arranged on plates.

Tips on CONTRACT

THE RARE VIENNA COUP

One of the most infrequent master plays at bridge is the Vienna coup by which the declarer deliberately sets up a card for an opponent. A grand slam at no trump by means of the coup and the squeeze is among the accomplishments of Willard Karn, who won the only national individual championship tourney ever held. Here was the hand:

KARN'S NORTH
A 10 6 2
K A 10
A K Q
A K 8

The bidding went: south pass; west pass; north two clubs; east pass; south three clubs; west pass; north six no trump; east pass; south seven clubs; west pass; north seven no trump.
With twelve certain tricks in the

north and south hands the average player might think that east could be squeezed so that the ten of hearts would be good. Karn's opponents were all ranking players who can keep track of cards. A pseudo squeeze to make them discard incorrectly would have failed. Here is Karn's explanation:
"This is a combination Vienna coup with an eleventh trick squeeze. I was playing an unfortunate contract and realized that leading dummy's clubs would hurt my hand if done early in play. Frankly I thought the squeeze impossible, but saw no other chance and at trick seven elected a forlorn hope out of my bag of bridge tricks by leading the ace of spades, which of course, sets up the opponents king. This, of course, is the essence of the Vienna coup."

"By this play I got two chances to win an otherwise impossible hand: 1—dropping the blank king of spades (this did not happen). 2—finding the spade king and the heart queen and knave in the same hand, which was the case.
"Tricks 8, 9 and 10 were taken by dummy's clubs. At this point east was reduced to the spade king and the heart queen-knave, dummy to spade queen, heart eight, club knave. I held the spade 10 and the heart king and ten. On trick 11 dummy led the club knave. I discarded the spade 10.
"East was hopelessly squeezed. Discarding a heart made my two hearts good. Discarding the spade king set up dummy's queen.
"In my ten years of bridge I have worked this play only twice and never have had it worked against me or for me. It is the caviar play of bridge and the most difficult to

recognize. It deserves the bridge V. C., Victoria Cross, Vienna Coup." The swing was 2,500 points, 1,500 for vulnerable grand slam, 800 for rubber, 245 for seven no trump tricks and 150 aces.

Use Marked Cards But The Game Is Always Honest!

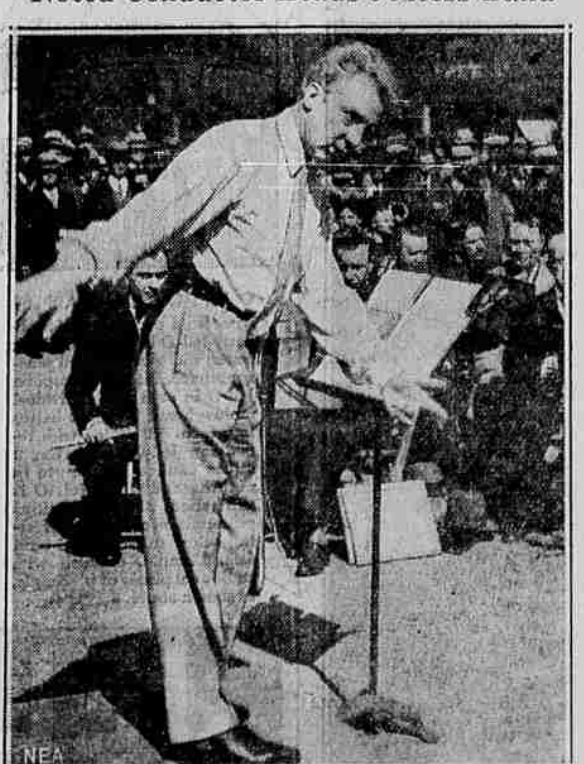

NEW YORK, May 12 (AP)—They play with marked cards but the game is honest.
The players are blind.
They have a club, thirteen girls—one extra so they always will be sure of three tables—and they meet to play three times a week, the evenings of Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday on the fifth floor of the New York association for the blind.
The cards are in Braille. Sure memory replaces sight.
This is how they plan contract: The cards are dealt, just as in an ordinary game, and so the bidding. The dummy lays down her hand, calling each card once, and the players memorize them.

dummy." West, "five of diamonds." North again "the six of diamonds from my hand." And so on to maybe game, or a set.

The cards are not held like a fan, but between the fingers so that the Braille marks are felt and the player is conscious of what she is holding. So keen is her memory that she can recall afterwards the complete layout of the 52 cards.

Score is kept on a Braille slate, but seldom is it referred to, additions being kept in the head also.

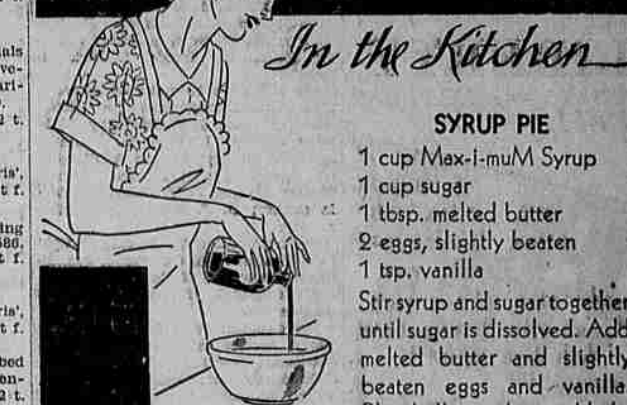
