

Ballots Printed For The May 20 Primary Elections

REPUBLICAN'S TICKET IS ONLY A LITTLE LONGER

Democrats Have Candidate — One or More — For Nearly Every Office That is at Stake.

Sample ballots for the May 20 primary elections in Union county have been printed, and will be ready for distribution in a few days.

The Republican ticket this year is only a little longer than the Democratic ballot, with both parties having candidates—one or more—for practically every position.

Republican voters will see the following names on their ticket:

Candidate for nomination for president: Joseph Irwin France, of Maryland.

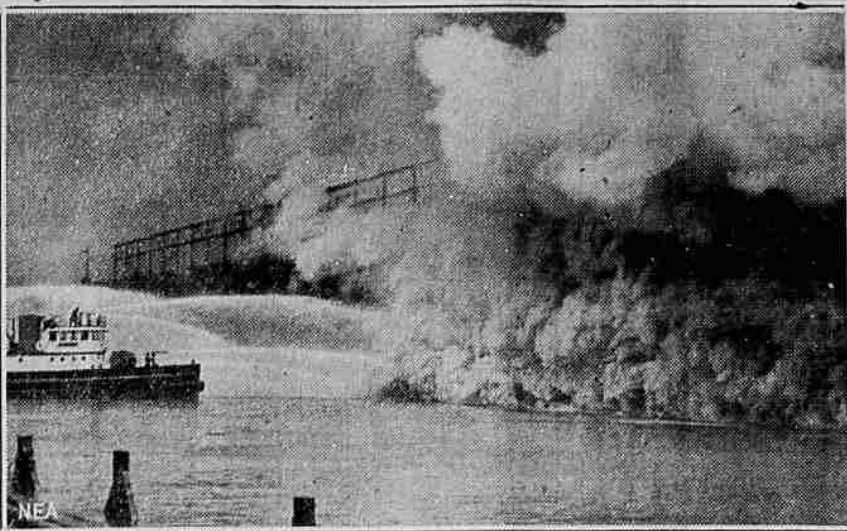
No candidate for vice president is listed.

FLAMES DESTROY GREAT PIERS IN NEW YORK



Behind these rolling clouds of smoke, raging flames were sweeping a \$2,500,000 pier of the Cunard Line in New York when this picture was taken. More than 700 firemen, fifty pieces of land fire apparatus and a half-dozen fireboats fought to prevent the blaze from spreading to adjoining piers, and surgeons treated scores of persons affected by the smoke. The liner, California was moved out into the Hudson River to escape the flames.

Baer, who weighed 16 pounds less than his opponent, used a smashing attack. A barrage of lefts and rights

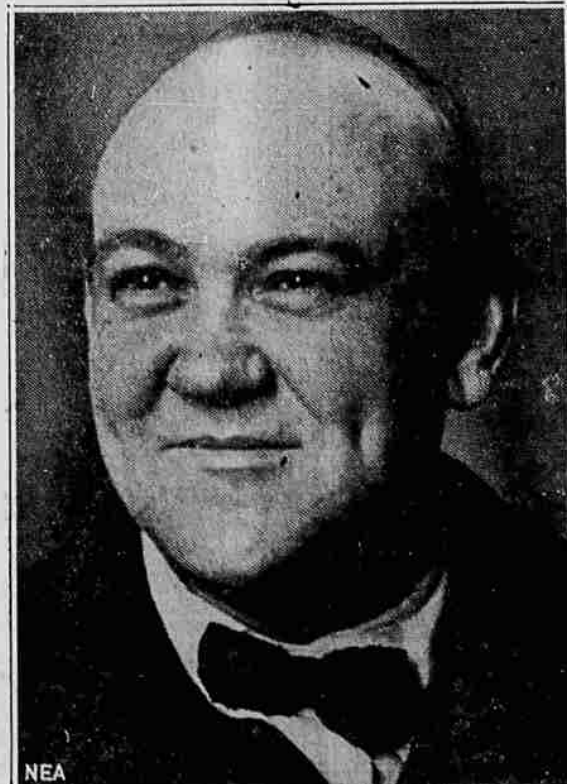
to the jaw sent Cobb down for a nine count. He attempted to continue but took such severe punishment Referee Tommy Irwin called a halt.

Here Are Principals in \$100,000 Lindbergh Ransom Fiasco



It was Mrs. Edward B. McLean, above, wife of a wealthy Washington publisher, who caused the arrest of Gaston B. Means several weeks after they had discussed plans for negotiating for the return of the kidnapped Lindbergh baby. Mrs. McLean told Department of Justice officials that she gave Means \$100,000, but that no results were forthcoming.



Gaston B. Means, above, told such a convincing story of being in touch with the kidnapers of the Lindbergh baby that he received, it is charged, \$100,000 from the wife of a prominent Washington publisher to negotiate for the child's return. But she waited in vain, and finally consulted Department of Justice agents. They arrested Means, who himself is a former Federal investigator.

In Washington

WASHINGTON — If there is anything to the gossip making the rounds in the capital on the eve of nominating convention time, then one of the most famous heirlooms of the Democratic party—exactly 100 years old—is probably headed for the ash heap.

It is the much maligned and praised two-thirds rule—that vehicle of Democratic conventions which requires a two-thirds vote to nominate a candidate for president and vice president.

None will go so far as to say that it will be abolished this year. But there are many who predict and favor action at the 1932 convention which would see its elimination in the Democratic scheme of things by 1936.

There's Senator Dill of Washington, recognized as one of the Roosevelt leaders in the senate. Joe Robinson of Arkansas, candidate for the vice presidency in 1928, Senator Tydings of Maryland, chairman of the senatorial elections committee, and Joe Byrns of Tennessee, chairman of the congressional elections committee, and others.

South Changing Stand
Representative Crisp of Georgia and Senator Pat Harrison of Mississippi also have expressed their accord with such a move.

It is the presence of these southern Democratic leaders in the ranks of those opposed to the two-thirds rule that gives rise to the opinion that something might be done.

Traditionally the south has clung to the rule. It afforded the famed "solid south" an opportunity to keep from the nomination any man to which it was opposed. But with this opposition apparently breaking down, it might be possible to start something at Chicago in June which would be productive of real results by 1936.

Agitation Not New
Agitation to abolish it is nothing new. It has been fought and defended since as has few other Democratic principles.

Glancing back over those 100 years, it is interesting to note that generally the candidate who received a majority of convention votes received the nomination.

Of course there are exceptions — one in particular.

Champ Clark of Missouri and Woodrow Wilson both received a majority at the 1912 convention in Baltimore, but it was Wilson who got the necessary two-thirds.

Famous Art Academy

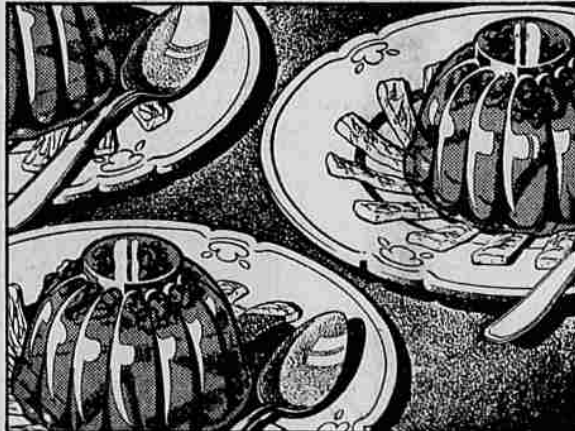

● **LEFT-OVER PINEAPPLE?**
Dissolve a package of Strawberry Jell-O in 1½ cups boiling water; add ½ cup canned pineapple juice. Place 1 tablespoon Jell-O in each of 4 individual molds; break 2 walnut halves into each. Fill molds with remaining Jell-O; chill. Cut 2 slices canned pineapple in eighths and when Jell-O is thickened, place 4 sections pineapple on each mold, pressing below surface. Chill until firm. Unmold. Garnish with additional pieces of pineapple, as shown above. Serves 4.

● **LEFT-OVER VEGETABLES?**
Dissolve a package of Lemon Jell-O in a pint of boiling water. Add 2 tablespoons vinegar, ½ teaspoon salt, and dash of Cayenne. Chill. When slightly thickened, fold in following ingredients: ½ cup raw carrots, finely chopped; 1 cup raw cabbage, finely shredded; 4 tablespoons green pepper, finely chopped. Turn into individual molds. Chill until firm. Unmold on crisp watercress. Serve with mayonnaise. Serves 6.
