

Consumption Of Poultry Cleans Up Most Supply

PORTLAND, May 12 (AP)—Stimulated by extreme low recent values, the greatest consumption of poultry within the memory of the local trade is keeping supplies fairly well cleaned up in the home territory.

Trade appears fully steady in butter and butterfat, with the market for the former continuing to show increased offerings.

General reductions appear in strawberries. Oregon berries are around \$2.75 crate for 24s.

Increasing local and mid-Columbia supplies of asparagus are bringing lower prices, mostly \$1.25 pyramid of 2 1/2 doz. bunches.

Generally reduced prices are showing for California new potatoes with sales of Garnets down to 3 1/2 @ 4 lb., both extremes.

Some betterment is reported in the country killed calf market with sales at 8c lb. for tops in a limited way.

Notes of wholesale trading: First full carload of Imperial valley cantaloupes is due here Saturday or Sunday.

There is a better feeling in the Columbia river salmon situation with prices firmer. Crabs are very scarce.

Home grown head lettuce is finding a fair call around \$1.25 crate.

Although the better grade of eggs went into storage in rather large volume, the report said, the rate of the into-storage movement decreased.

(Continued From Page One) The measure, which would join the two state colleges into one at Corvallis, create a teachers' college at Eugene and junior college at Ashland and La Grande, eliminating the Monmouth Normal school, will require 17,000 signatures to place the bill on the November ballot.

In the United States, Buffalo, Indianapolis and Helena, Mont., ceased to be episcopal areas, and abroad the episcopates of Paris, France; Peking, China; Korea and Calcutta were eliminated.

The Buffalo and Indianapolis delegations contested the abolition of their home areas in a debate that continued three and one-half hours, but their protests and arguments were met by answers citing an episcopal fund deficit of \$375,000 and the insistence of the "people back home" that drastic steps be taken to reduce the overhead of church administration.
