Portland Gets More Hits But Also More Errors—Seattle Loses to Los Angeles.

Turner, who relieved Yde on the mound for Hollywood in the eighth, stopped a Sacramento rally.

The rejuvenated Mission Reds downed Portland again with an eighth inning rally which overcame a Beaver lead. The Mission heavy hitters knocked Dietrich out of the box for Portland and took the game 8-5. Los Angeles batsmen hammered

four Seattle pitchers for a 13-10 victory last night. The Angels tied the series at two all by emerging from their hitting slump. At that, however, the Indians gathered 16 hits to the Angels' 15.
