Petrolle Beats Bat Battalino In Chicago Go

CHICAGO, May 21 (AP)—Bat Battalino ought to be about ready to admit that Billy Petrolle can lick him.

The former world featherweight champion, fortified with rare courage, stood in the Chicago stadium ring last night and traded blows with the old Fargo Express, and even knocked him down for a count of nine in the first round.

But her best over, Petrolle had earned a ten-round decision. And except for the first and tenth round, Battalino took a decisive beating.

In the middle of the first round a whistling left hook landed squarely on Petrolle's chin and he went down to remain as long as he dared. They were about even until the sixth but after that session, Petrolle clearly was the master.

Seeking to wipe out a 12-round knockout verdict scored against him two months ago in New York by Petrolle, Battalino plied into a withering two-handed fire that drew blood from his tender nose, puffed out his lips and ripped open a cut over one eye.

The bat was not one-sided, however, and the disappointingly small crowd of about 11,000 got everything it paid for.

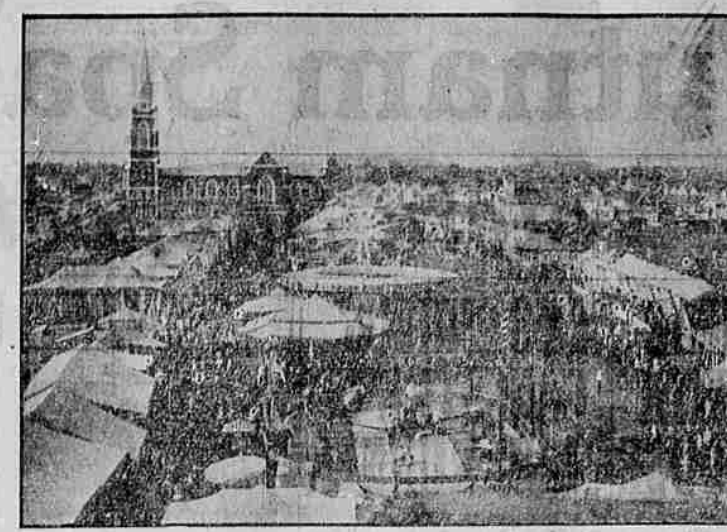
Petrolle clearly earned a shot at Tony Canzoneri's lightweight title, if the stadium is able to arrange the championship match.
