

Gene Sarazen Takes The Lead In The British Open

NEW YORKER GETS SUB-PAR 70 WITH FIELD MOSTLY IN

MacDonald Smith, Also American, Held Early Lead in First Round With a 71 Card.

BANTWICK, England, June 8 (AP)—Gene Sarazen, New York professional, today scored a 70 for the first round of the British open golf championship, and took the lead with a card of 71.

MacDonald Smith, one of the three leading Americans, scored a 71 earlier today to tie for the early lead of the first round with the two British professionals, W. H. Davies and Charles Whitcombe.

The American slight just missed a two-way post on the last green which would have given him a 70 and the lead.

Alaska

It was 200 feet long, 44 feet beam, 10 feet hold, having two engines with a 10-foot diameter stroke and a cylinder of 40-inch bore. She carried eight boilers, 32 feet long by 42 inches, and her side wheels of 38 feet diameter had buckets 16 1/2 feet long.

Sighting Submarines

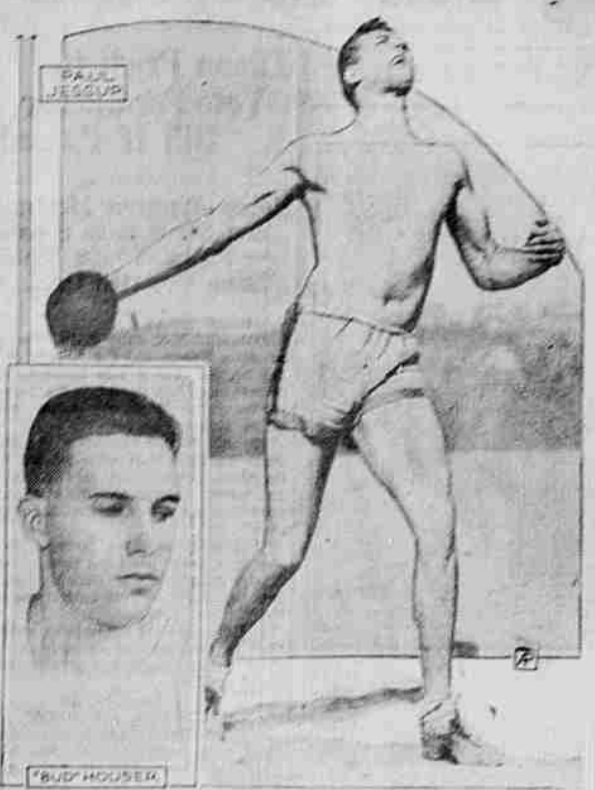

Jessup Seem Certain
Unless Jessup falls short of the mark that has been second-best in Olympic competition, he figures to win handsily. The big Washington star achieved a record throw of 188 feet 8 1/2 inches in the national championships at Pittsburgh in 1928. He defended the title in 1930. He threw 187 feet 8 1/2 inches in 1931. Jim Dawson set a world record of 194 feet 1 1/2 inches in 1932, but he failed to do better than third in the Olympics. In 1928, Krenz, one of the American favorites, failed to qualify in his specialty. The German, Hoffmann, who had exceeded the world record, failed to place in the Olympic trials.
