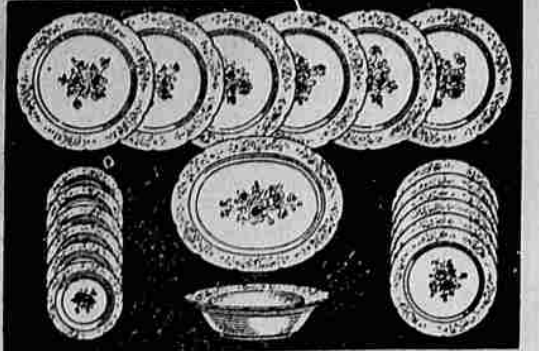

Weaker Tone In Egg Market Is Causing Worry

PORTLAND, June 8 (AP) — Intense weakness underlying the general egg market trade is causing much concern not only to private firms but to co-operative interests.

Undertone of the market appears to gather weakness instead of strength and advancing prices as would be due under normal conditions when supplies begin to dwindle.

It is only with much difficulty, and not entirely successful at that, that the price is being maintained in some quarters.

Market for butter continues to reflect general steadiness in the local field. There was no change in price on the open market for the day for either prints or cubes, also butterfat.

Preparations are being made in the trade to make further cuts of 1c lb. in the already low record value here.

While there appears a fairly steady tone for top quality country killed lamb, heavy weights are reported as dragging and inclined to rule lower.
