

Gene Sarazen Holds Lead in Second Round At 139

LONG-HITTING N. Y. PRO CARDS SPARKLING 69

Misses Establishing Course Record By One Stroke — Percy Allis Next Closest With a 142

SANDWICH, Eng., June 9 (AP)—Gene Sarazen, long hitting New York professional, tied the course record at Prince's with a 69 today to take the lead in the second round of the British open golf championship with his 77-69-139.

Tommy Armour, defending champion, finished with a 70 and 145 just as Gene was starting out, and his fellow American's fine performance stimulated Sarazen to do his best.

Gene was out in 35 and home in 34 for a card of five under par.

Percy Allis, British professional, was the closest to the American among the early finishers with a 71 for a 36 hole total of 142.

Sarazen had birdies at the second, fifth, 12th, 16th and 17th holes and was over par only once, on the ninth hole. His card:

Sarazen failed to set a new record because he half smothered an approach shot to the home green where he had an easy four in eight for a 58.

Reds Lose Seven in a Row; Drop To Seventh Place

The Cincinnati bubble, one of the prettiest of the spring crop, appears to have exploded in Manager Howley's lap.

Seven straight defeats have removed the Reds from the first division and dropped them into seventh place.

Chick Hafey's illness, which has deprived the club of its clean-up hitter, and pitcher Al Johnson's inability to pitch his regular turn, contributed to the Reds' rapid tumble.

They committed four errors in the first four innings yesterday to lose their second to Bill Terry's revitalized New York Giants, 9 to 2. All the Giants' runs were unearned.

The see-saw scrap for the league leadership saw the Chicago Cubs bounce up again by defeating the Brooklyn Dodgers, 7 to 5. In 14 innings while Boston was taking a 15-9 beating from the St. Louis Cardinals, Charlie Root, relief pitcher for the Cubs, held Brooklyn to one hit for the last six innings of their struggle and finally was rewarded in the 14th when Cubby Hartnett tripled and Bill Jurge doubled to drive across the winning runs.

The Cardinals pounded four Boston pitchers for 30 hits in scoring their fifth straight victory.

The Phillies took a free-scoring affair from Pittsburgh, 11 to 10. Dave Barber provided three Pirate runs with a homerun in the ninth.

The two eminent southpaws, Vernon Gomez and Bob Grove, continue to burn up the American league in their battle for individual pitching supremacy. Gomez won his tenth victory of the year and his tenth in succession in beating Cleveland, 3 to 1.

Grove gave the A's their winning run with a homer in the eighth. Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig knocked in all five Yankee runs, each hitting a homerun and a single.

The day's most timely blow was delivered by Charlie Berry of the Chicago White Sox. Two were out in the ninth inning and the bases filled when he tripled to center and thereby defeated Washington, 3 to 2.

Goose Goslin delivered a homerun, a triple and a single and drove in four runs as the St. Louis Browns crushed Boston, 11 to 4.

Jimmy Henigan America's Best Bet in Marathon in the Olympics

NEW YORK, June 9 (AP)—The most colorful of all the chapters of Olympic history have been written about the classic Marathon. The winner at Los Angeles this August, whether he be the Japanese, the Italian or the American, will bear off the most prized of all the awards for foot-racing prowess.

There was a Greek holiday back in 1896 when the first Olympic revival was crowned by the triumph of the little shepherd, Spiridon Louys, over the world's best long distance runners.

They said Louys came down from the hills and spent two nights in prayer before the race, which was in memory of the classic trek of Pheidippides in 490 B. C. to Athens with news of the Greek victory over the Persians at the Battle of Marathon.

Michel Testu, a French baker boy, won the Marathon in 1900. Cheers mistle.

At St. Louis in 1904 the first American winner, J. T. Hicks of Boston, was almost overlooked in the excitement caused by the arrival first of Fred Lorz of the Missouri.

Lorz, it seemed, gave up early in the race and climbed into an auto. About five miles from the stadium the machine broke down, so Lorz, seeking the rest, decided to run the rest of the way. He hailed as the winner when he trotted into the stadium, and it was while the hubbub was still on that he, a very young young man, arrived.

Too Much Help

Of course the most exciting of all Olympic marathons was in 1908, when Johnny Hayes of the New York department store clerk was finally declared the winner after Dorando, the Italian, first into the London stadium had collapsed and been assisted to the finish by British officials.

Since the triumph of the South African policeman, K. K. McArthur, in the 1912 marathon, the Finns have pretty well dominated the event. Hannes Kolehmainen set the present record of 2:32:35.8 in 1920, and Albin Stenroos, a cabinet worker, scored for Finland in 1924.

The fast victor, El Quat, French Algerian dispatch bearer, checked the Finnish streak in 1928, but he has since turned professional.

This year the race looks to be "wide open" unless the celebrated Paavo Nurmi can shake off his present suspension and try for the big prize for the first time. If in shape, probably would spread-eagle the field and knock from 10 to 15 minutes off the record.

Observers and chief contenders likely will include Paul de Bruyn, the German youth, now living in New York, who won the Boston Marathon handily in fine time this spring; Matti Lahti, the Finlander of Kyrönen, representing Finland; Yehudi and Takahashi, two Japanese who have beaten Olympic record time, and their compatriot, Tadao and Junzo, Zabala, sensational young Argentine distance runner, Ritola, like Nurmi, never has run the Olympic marathon, but possesses superior racing ability. If able to go the long road, America's hopes are not especially bright against this class. Jimmy Henigan, who has already earned a place on the U. S. team by finishing second to de Bruyn at Boston, was only 39th in the 1928 Olympic race. Clarence de Mar, who wore the Olympic shield at Stockholm back in 1912, seems past his prime. Jole Ray is a pro.

MEETING HELD TODAY

PORTLAND, June 9 (AP)—Agreements relative to the expenditure of secondary highway funds this year were made with Jackson, Douglas and Klamath counties by the state highway commission.

Jackson county's quota of \$43,000 will be applied on the Sams valley road and a survey of the Little Butte creek road after deducting \$8,000 for general maintenance. On the Sams valley road \$20,000 will be spent and on the Little Butte creek road \$3,000.

In Douglas county with an appropriation of \$42,000, the Tiller-Trail road will receive \$15,000 and the Sutherland-Ellison road \$5,000. For maintenance \$11,000 will be deducted from the total secondary fund.

In Klamath county which is to receive secondary highway funds of \$53,100, there will be deducted \$12,800 for maintenance. On the West Side and North Klamath road \$16,500 will be applied and on the survey of the Klamath Falls-Weston road \$10,000. The remainder of the appropriation will be held in reserve for unemployment relief work emergency.

The commission authorized the suggestion of County Judge Reynolds of Lake county to include in a five year program, the oiling of the Fremont highway, elimination of curves and oiling of the Lakeview-Klamath Falls highway and the surfacing of Burns-Lakeview road.

The commission authorized the leasing of the Sunset Inn property on the Old Oregon Trail east of Pendleton for a term of five years.

On recommendation of San Boardman, park engineer, the commission gave authority to the unemployment relief committee of Pendleton to work up into cordwood, fallen and diseased trees in the park areas in the Blue mountains. The wood is to be hauled to Pendleton and distributed to the needy this winter. The commission indicated that the clearing

Football Star Of Earlier Day Shoots Himself

SEATTLE, June 9 (AP)—An all-day search ended last night with the finding of the body of Be Van Presley, 42, general manager of the Alaska Steamship company, slumped beside a tree in woods nearby here, a bullet wound in his head. A pistol lay by his side.

Leaving his office at 9 o'clock yesterday morning, Presley told his secretary he would return within an hour. By noon, he had failed to reappear and a description of his car was broadcast to all police provier cars.

The abandoned machine was found at 10 o'clock last night in West Seattle and a short time later a search of nearby woods revealed his body. Relatives who were summoned completed the identification.

Presley, a former University of Washington football star, returned to Seattle several weeks ago from Alaska. He had been under a severe mental strain, company officials said today, and seemed to be on the verge of a nervous breakdown.

During his years in Alaska, he was general manager of the vast Guggenheim interests for a long time, including the Kennecott mine and the Copper River and Northwestern railway. A "welcome home" banquet was held for him on his return here.

Their examination, coroner's deputies said, showed the bullet had entered his head near the left ear. Powder burns were found about the wound.

On his person was a checkbook, showing a balance of \$1125.

Presley was rated by sports experts as one of the greatest football centers in the history of Pacific coast football, although he played on the Washington team some 20 years ago.

He was known as an "iron man," playing through four seasons without ever being taken out of a game. His team won every game in the four years.

He is survived by his widow, a son and a daughter.
