MEMBERS OF BONUS ARMY EJECT "REDS"

(Continued From Page One) were brought in early this morning, and delivered to the camp officers. The outbreak of contagious disease among the veterans, district officials spoke of quarantine, redoubled their efforts to have the various states discourage more march-

ers, and sought arrangements to dislodge the men at some of the old forts and military posts which surround the capital. Hoover, Curtis, Garner Petitioned the veterans yesterday, through Father James R. Cox, but Pittsburgh and a committee, left petitions for payment of the bonus with President Hoover, Vice President Curtis and Speaker Garner. Curtis was the only one of the three they saw, but their plea was read in both chambers of congress and was inserted in today's congressional record.

PITTSBURGH VETS ACT — At a meeting of about 25 ex-service men last night to which the various American Legion posts of the county apparently were not invited, an organization was formed to protest adoption of the pending bonus bill. In a statement of principle today, the group said it favored utmost consideration for all disabled veterans and their dependents, but feels that aside from payment of adjusted compensation, when due, the nation is without further financial obligation to the men who were in good physical condition when they were mustered out after the war.

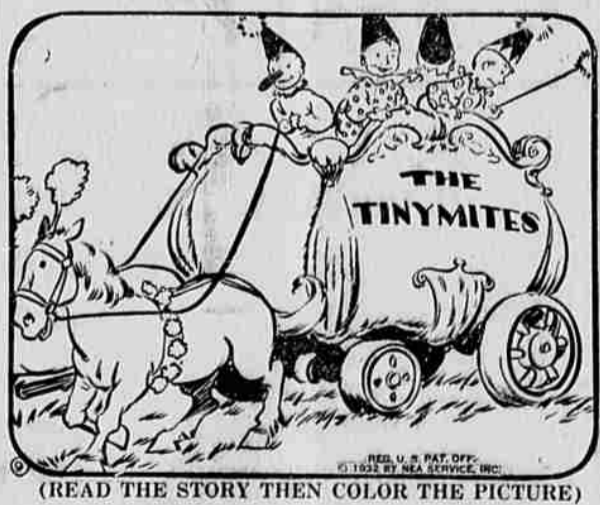

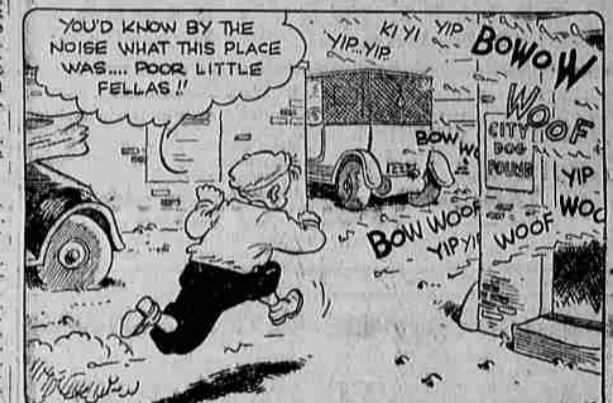
